New Partners, a New Field and a New Budget

In 2019 and 2020, the Lord opened doors for us to expand our global partnership connections to Rwanda. Through our New City-South Rwandan refugees we entered into a significant relationship with Beth Ammi Christian Fellowship, a network of churches in rural Rwanda and Eastern Congo. Through a partnership with Third Millennium Ministries and Southwood PCA church in Alabama we provided free theological training materials through Beth Ammi to a group of 50 pastors.

In January of 2020, a team traveled to Rwanda where we shared "Sonship" training with the pastors and also visited a village church in Nyaruguru that is helping to care for 700 orphans who lost their parents as a result of the trauma of the genocide.

The government of Rwanda has closed all orphanages and has asked local churches to encourage their members to provide care for the orphans, with no government assistance. As a result, most of these orphans have no access to education because they

cannot afford the \$300/year required to attend the government-run public school.

As an increase to our regular missions budget, we are seeking 50 members of our congregation to consider a \$30/month missions pledge toward the education of these Rwandan orphans.

We are also seeking another 50 families/individuals to consider a \$30/month pledge for the orphans who attend the New Beginnings School in Lomé, Togo. We have been long supporters of this school which has recently exploded to over 200 students and is expanding their program to include secondary education.

As always, we know you cannot give what you do not have. But if the Lord has blessed you with more income than you need for your life necessities, we would urge you to prayerfully consider sharing some of that with these children in Togo and Rwanda, as well as continued support for our other fields. The Lord loves a cheerful giver and has promised that He will bless us in return by taking care of all our needs and even providing us with more resources to share with those in need.



NEW CITY FELLOWSHIP MISSIONS exists to enable the members of NCF to partner with the global church for the advancement of the Gospel by preaching grace and doing justice in their local communities. We are also committed to participating in starting new churches in the unreached communities of the world. We seek to obey this calling by:

Developing relationships with national pastors and churches in the countries to which God calls us. We will seek to find ways to mutually engage in sharing the Gospel through word and deed, including theological training and partnering in compassion ministries. We will be committed both to sending NCF teams on short-term missions trips and to bringing national pastors to St. Louis for our mutual instruction and encouragement in the faith.

Developing priority field focus for our missions programs through identifying communities in the world where we can have a focused, long-term investment, based on NCF congregational and pastoral leadership commitment.

Supporting U.S. missionaries who will either help connect us to national churches with whom we can partner, or engage in evangelism and church planting in unreached communities.

THE KINGDOM RESTORATION SOCIETY (KRS) is an international

mission agency, headquartered at New City Fellowship-St Louis. In its local mission outreach, NCF operates on two levels that are often interwoven, but still remain organizationally distinct from one another. There are things we do missionally in our own community that are more exclusively the work of New City Fellowship as a church and then there are areas of outreach that we do collectively with groups of other Christians and other churches throughout the St Louis area. The same is true in our global mission work. We do U.S. mission work and partner with others to do global mission work. The venue for partnership locally is called *Restore St Louis*. The venue for partnership globally is *The Kingdom Restoration Society* (KRS). *Last year over \$515,000 in donations passed through this Mission Society. Those are all donations outside of and in addition to the NCF Missions Budget*.

At NCF-St Louis we use KRS as the structure for sending our own short-term missionaries overseas, including Tim and Kathy Rice working in Vanga, Congo, and Daniel and April Murphree in Myanmar. The most recent change to the charter of KRS is that it is now functioning as an Ordination Society which means New City Fellowship-St Louis, New City-Lomé, New City-Kinshasa, New City-Nairobi and New City-Burma can all ordain

leaders and church planters for the gospel ministry.

In addition, we are partnering with Third Millennium Ministries to offer Theological Training courses in many languages, both in the U.S. and overseas.

Daniel and April Murphree are working to disciple church-planters to develop a reconciling vision for cross-cultural ministry. They are also leading a team charged to translate discipleship materials from Third Millennium into Burmese. This is all in addition to supporting local leaders like Pastor Kham in developing his own vision for Kingdom-oriented missions in his home country (as well as being supervised by him!).

Pastor Zam Khat Kham is working to train pastors and elders in Kalemyo, a remote city in northern Burma that is a strategic crossroads between many tribal groups. This year he was able to impact areas in Eastern Burma as well.

Kathy Rice, RN and Tim Rice, MD have served in Vanga, Democratic Republic of Congo since 2015. Kathy leads the Nursing School in Vanga, educating a group of 240 of Congo's future nurses and midwives. Tim serves as the Medical Director of the 380-bed Vanga

Evangelical Hospital which served 1690 outpatient visits, and 5800 hospitalized patients in 2019 and trains 8 residents and 50 medical students in their clinical rotations. Together Kathy and Tim want to see God raise up the next generation of Congolese medical leaders: nurses,

doctors and health administrators to serve and disciple others in Congo. They are in the process of team building and are recruiting for a maintenance supervisor, an accountant, a kindergarten teacher and a general surgeon.









Sardar Din became a Christian as a small illiterate boy through the witness of American missionaries. They provided his early education and challenged him to dedicate his life for Christian service, which he did. In 1992, Sardar began a Christian day

school, Calvin's Academy. The school has grown from 11 students to over 2,200 on four different campuses. In addition to administering and teaching in the seminary, he started a Sunday morning Bible study with as many as 150 people attending. Sardar

pastors a group that meets at the seminary and also teaches a Bible class in Lahore.

It is the desire of Rev. Din, together with his wife Anila, to spend the remaining years of his life promoting the Kingdom of Jesus Christ in his native land.

Congo is the largest area of missions activity for us as a church, both in terms of the numbers of ministries and the amount of support we send.

Pastor Leon Mukendi and his wife Adolphine returned to Kinshasa in

2016 to start NCF-Kinshasa. This church plant is in one of the poorest communities in the city. In addition to supporting the needs of the church, we send funds to help with orphan care and medical care.

Lamb of God Christian school has an enrollment of 566 students. the teachers receive a salary of \$100/month. Our support pays the salaries of 20 teachers.



Addressing the need for educating the large population of street children, they started an elementary school in their home, hosting about 200 students pre-k through 5th grade, including some Muslim children. 

Craig Jones, a Zimbabwe national, teaches theology at the Theological College of Zimbabwe. His wife Mell has been ministering to the large number of orphans suffering from the difficulties resulting from the political chaos in the country.

Zimbabwe has had two years of drought and is experiencing 400% inflation.

Despite the very difficult situation, the church is growing. We are partnering with five churches, two in the city of Bulawayo and three in a rural area one hour from the city. Currently we are

assisting a daycare center for street children and widows who care for orphans. We would like to expand our assistance in 2020 by providing food aid for rural believers who have one meal a day during the current drought.




