

A midwife comes to Mary's home which is made from cow dung and delivers the babies there. There is no post delivery care. Two days later Mary begins to run a fever. She is very sick. She needs medical help. The closest clinic is 7 1/2 miles away. There is no room at that clinic. She must travel an additional 6 miles to the next clinic. Mary is anemic. She needs medicine. Her family doesn't own a vehicle. Walking is the only option. How will she get the help she needs?



Mission French Africa Ministries

Exists to preach and teach the Gospel to win French speaking Africans to Christ, to disciple African Christians in Biblical stewardship, and produce Radio Broadcasts preaching the Good News of Jesus Christ..

Pastor Paul & Charlotte broadcast their programs daily on 16 radio stations: 3 in Congo; 3 in Central African Republic; 2 in Bénin; 2 in Togo; 2 in Ivory Coast; 2 in Cameroon; 1 in Chad, and 1 in Congo-Brazzaville. Each day in Sub-Saharan West Africa more than 20 million people spread out across 8 French speaking nations tune in to a local radio station to hear the life changing message of Jesus.

Hundreds of emails from listeners have been received requesting audios of the teachings and prayers. **God is opening hearts. People are saying yes to Jesus!** In Paul's words "I'm getting old. It's time to pass this ministry on to young men who live locally in Africa. It's time to raise up leaders in French speaking Africa." Paul and Charlotte are on a mission to do just that! By building a recording studio in Kinshasa, Democratic Republic of Congo, they will have a location to begin recording messages with young men who are receiving training in presenting the gospel through radio broadcasts.

At Family Church we are committed to building a recording studio so that these French speaking countries, made up mostly of muslims, will be able to hear about Jesus within the safety of their own homes.

\$5,000 will help create a state of the art digital recording studio in Kinshasa.

Well Drilling in the Amazon Jungle

Since 2015 *Jason and Kristyna have been working to plant a church with the Waiapi people group in the Amazon Jungle.* They are part of team who were some of the first outsiders to live among the Waiapi. The Waiapi are a primitive people group who live scattered across the jungle in northern Brazil. The work Jason and Kristyna do involves supplying medical help, discipling men and women, working alongside the people, translating and recording the Bible into the Waiapi language. Each day is different. It has been a long process of language learning, teaching, translations and now discipleship. **Family Church** has played a key role in building the Translation Office in Toucano Dois. Despite numerous setbacks they are now seeing believers meeting together with a desire to see a church planted.



The Waiapi people are plagued by many health concerns.

Many problems stem from not having access to clean water. *It's ironic that in the middle of the Amazon jungle with rivers, creeks, and nearly daily rainfall that access to water would be such a big concern.* Tekoa Water - well drilling in the Amazon Jungle - has been established to not only provide a source of clean water but also an avenue in which the gospel can be preached.

In order to dig each well a site viability study is needed at each site BEFORE doing the projects. This involves determining whether the equipment can be transported to the site via helicopter, truck or boat and determine where they can dig in the region.

It's a ***BIG DREAM*** that God is bringing to fruition. ***At Family Church we are committed to help make that dream a reality.***

Our goal is to provide the funds for ***6 wells in the Amazon Jungle*** at a cost of just ***\$6,500 per well.*** The difference clean water will make in a community is life changing. The opportunity to share Jesus —eternity changing.
