

I enjoy paging through a hymnal. In the pages of a hymnal, you'll find songs of comfort and hope, and songs that teach the great doctrines of Scripture. Bill Gaither has often mentioned that we do not sing old songs because they are old, but because they are great and have survived.

The hymns that have touched me the most in recent days, are the songs that are prayers. Good examples of familiar hymns of prayer are, "I Need Thee Every Hour," "Rock of Ages," "How Great Thou Art," "Nearer, My God, to Thee," "Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty," and "Great Is Thy Faithfulness."

I have used these hymns in my personal prayer time. I know some believers may not favor prayers that have been written out, but it is often helpful to listen to what others pray as they worship God. In listening, or in this case reading or singing another person's prayer, we might learn some great scriptural truths about our great Savior.

The hymns I've mentioned are familiar to many believers, but I also like to sing and play hymns of prayer that are unfamiliar to me. I don't remember ever hearing "Jesus, My Savior Look on Me", but after examining it, I found that it is a wonderful acknowledgement of who Christ is and all that we have and need in Him.

1) Jesus, my Savior, look on me,  
For I am weary and oppressed;  
I come to cast myself on Thee:

**Thou art my Rest.**

2) Look down on me, for I am weak;  
I feel the toilsome journey's length;  
Thine aid omnipotent I seek:

**Thou art my Strength.**

3) I am bewildered on my way,  
Dark and tempestuous is the night;  
O send Thou forth some cheering ray!

**Thou art my Light.**

4) When Satan flings his fiery darts,  
I look to Thee, my terrors cease;  
Thy cross a hiding place imparts:

**Thou art my Peace.**

5) Standing alone at Jordan's brink,  
In that tremendous, latest strife,  
Thou wilt not suffer me to sink:

**Thou art my life.**

6) Thou wilt my every want supply,  
E'en to the end, whate'er befall;  
Through life, in death, eternally,

**Thou art my All.**

**Verse 1- Jesus is our rest.** As we age, we quickly find that sleep doesn't come as easily or as deeply as it once did. There are many nights, for what seems like no reason at all, sleep often eludes us, and that leads us to the situation that is described in the hymn, "He Giveth More Grace". The hymn reads, "When we have exhausted our store of endurance, when our strength has failed, e're the day is half done." We can certainly appreciate Jesus' promise when He said, "Come unto me, all you who labor, and are heavy laden and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28)

**Verse 2- Jesus is our strength.** This truth is never realized by us in its fullest extent, until we admit, as the author of this song did, that we are weak. The second verse of the song speaks of a long, toilsome journey, and asks for the help of an omnipotent God. Paul, who so eloquently wrote of God's strength and our weakness,

puts these two opposite themes into a working relationship when He says, "for when I am weak then I am strong." (2 Corinthians 12:10) God's promise to Isaiah should provide all the assurance we need for our long, toilsome journey, "Fear not, I am with you; be not dismayed; for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, yes, I will uphold you with the right hand of my righteousness." (Isaiah 41:10)

**Verse 3- Jesus is our light.** This verse speaks of a dark and tempestuous night. The great old hymn, "God Leads Us Along," written after the composer's house was set on fire by those in opposition to his preaching, tells how God leads us along, "on the mount, where the sun shines so bright," and also, "in the valley in darkest of night." We all face those night seasons, with darkness so thick, and a season so long, that we can feel overwhelmed. It seems that there will never be light to brighten our pathway, and that we will never find our way. In those night seasons we can be grateful for the comforting words of our Lord, "I am the light of the world, he who follows Me, shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life." (John 8:12)

**Verse 4- Jesus is our peace.** Jesus told His disciples prior to His death, resurrection and ascension, "Peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto you: not as the world gives, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid. These things I have spoken unto you, that in Me you might have peace. In the world you shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world." (John 14:27, 16:33)

**Verse 5- Jesus is our life.** The hymn speaks of Jesus being our life, in

relationship to our physical death, which in turns takes me back to the story of Lazarus, the brother of Mary and Martha. Lazarus was sick, and died before Jesus arrived. In a conversation with Martha, Jesus made the bold statement, "I am the resurrection and the life; he that believes in Me though he were dead, yet shall he live: And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die." (John 11:25-26)

**Verse 6- Jesus is our all.** He is depicted in the final verse of this hymn, as the one who supplies all of our need, no matter what happens, and will continue to supply every need that we have throughout eternity. Paul told the Philippians, who were faithful in giving to God's work, "but my God shall supply all your need, according to His riches in glory, by Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:19) Paul likewise told the Corinthians, "not that we are sufficient of ourselves to think anything as of ourselves; but our sufficiency is of God." (2 Corinthians 3:5)

I encourage you to use these hymns or others that you are familiar with when you pray. My hope is that you will find praying in this manner enhances both your prayer life and your relationship with God.


