on about the goodness of God. But He was like the scripture says, being *wonderfully kind, tolerant and patient with me*. He chased me for 10 years and I began to understand, especially after my abortions, that His goodness truly leads us to repentance.

He reminds me all the time how patient He has been with me through the years, especially when I start complaining about somebody else's choices. His goodness will lead our family and friends to repentance because we have experienced it personally in our own lives.

## Prayer:

Oh Father let us not forget how patient and kind You have been to us through the years when we did not know you yet. And even when we did know You, how long it took us to truly surrender to Your ways. We repent on behalf of our family and friends who have not chosen You Jesus and those who believe they are right.
