Welcome

Welcome to the final One project gathering. You may have heard Japhet tell the story of how the One project came about in July 2010 in a hotel room in Denver—just him and a few of his friends, including Alex Bryan, Terry Swenson, Sam Leonor, and Tim Gillespie, who are presenting here this weekend. (Dany Hernandez and Eddie Hypolite were connected online.) I thought I'd tell it this time. Often when I'm at the One project and people ask me where I'm from and I say "Boulder, Colorado," they get all excited. "You must go to Japhet's church!" That's one way of putting it. Another way is that I'm his wife. I know where all the bodies are buried. Or I would if there were any bodies, which obviously there are not.

I don't really remember the 2010 thing. I maybe remember that Japhet went to Denver for some reason or other. The One project appeared on my radar in February 2011 when Japhet phoned me from Atlanta just after the first larger gathering (list of participants on page 91) had finished. I was at my house in Michigan in the evening, after a long work day. I was pairing socks in our bedroom. The kids were in the basement clobbering each other with cushions and screaming. The temperature was in the single digits and it was snowing outside. Huge drifts obstructed my views from the windows and the entire structure of the house trembled against the vicious and unrelenting howl of the wind.

Now, whenever I tell this story and I get to this point, some rather inattentive individual will pipe up and ask, "How can you possibly remember that it was snowing?" *Hello? I was in Michigan.* If my story were to have taken place in Seattle, where I grew up, it would have been raining. If it had been in Boulder, where I currently live, well, the unmistakable aroma of marijuana would have filled the air. In Michigan, it's always winter and never Christmas (yet it's one of my favorite places in the world). My children will deny it, but they are pretty much always screaming. And yet they are my favorite people in the world. Life is nothing if not a complete surprise all the time.

So Japhet was super excited about this thing he was doing with his friends, these people from Denver or wherever—not a one of whom was known to me. He was sort of babbling happily about it and shouting promises down the line as if he were running for Congress. Things were going to be better, blah, blah. I wondered whether this giddiness was the result of some kind of side effect from the medication he was taking after his surgery to treat his most recent bout of cancer—and I was almost pleased given that his previous side effects had been: 1) grumpiness, and 2) lethargy. But at the same time, I must confess that I did not share his excitement. I didn't think we needed another "thing" in our lives. We were busy enough with jobs and kids—and I had just finished applying to grad schools to begin my Ph.D. "If I wanted another *thing*," I thought, "I'd get a Saint Bernard and ride him around as if he were a pony." I allowed myself to hope for a moment that this new thing would fizzle out, but I knew that it wouldn't because Japhet's things never fizzle out.



It was not until 2012 that I attended a One project gathering—in my home town of Seattle. (That's me pictured on the left with my friends from England, Dan and Diana Sabatier.) I did not expect to be impressed. I arrived bearing the customary grim determination with which I approach most activities, prepared to smile nicely and get it over with. What I found was an incredible community of people who were each opening their hearts to the possibility that Jesus might really be able to work through them, that a focus on Him would make a difference to their families and communities. In spite of myself, I found it profoundly moving. Altogether I've attended just nine of the gatherings—three in Seattle, three in San Diego (including this one), and one each in Chicago, England, and Holland—they have consistently reminded me of why community is important. People are so much better and stronger when they're together. When they're focused on a common good. In this case, when they're focused on the person of Jesus—a focus that is absolutely transformative.

Lots of people have come up to me recently and asked in whispered tones why we're closing the One project down. After all, it's been such a success. So many people have loved the experience and have made new decisions for Christ as a result of attending. It has indeed been wonderful—but it's not as if any of us are giving up. We've done this for a few years; now we'll do something else. We'll continue to focus on Jesus and on building faith in the context of strong local and global communities. I'm a little less freaked out by the prospect of new "things" in my life. Bring 'em, I say—especially if they come with new and wonderful friends. Or weird and annoying ones. Who can afford to be fussy?

The relationships we have with each other are so important—and yet we so often fail to make the most of them. I have a drawing at home with a caption that reads, "There are things you do because they feel right and they may make no sense and they may make no money and it may be the real reason we are here: to eat each other's cooking and say it was good." People sometimes act as if love is a soft version of the Gospel, but I think it's the real deal. Really loving people—in the midst of the messiness that constitutes human lives—can be so hard, but it's possibly all that matters. This One project community has done a good job of loving people these past few years. I've felt it. I'm pretty sure you have too. Let's keep that going through the rest of our lives, no matter where we find ourselves.

Some of you are familiar with the way the One project works; others are new. Let me just quickly explain how it goes. Each speaker will give a Reflection around a particular topic. Afterward, you will discuss the ideas shared in the Recalibrate sessions. There are questions in the program to help guide your discussion. Abide by the rules of civil discourse. Make sure everyone gets a chance to speak and that no one dominates the conversation. Hear and respect one another. When it's time for breaks or meals, find people to connect with and talk to them about their faith journeys. People's stories are always simply amazing.

- What are the three biggest obstacles to relevance in the Adventist church right now?




KARL HAFFNER

He loves playing table games (Acquire and Codenames being his faves), marvels often at his ineptitude in golf, and tries to read every bestseller on the *NY Times* nonfiction list. He is the author of a bunch of good books and writes regularly for a variety of periodicals. He has two bachelor's degrees, two masters degrees and a Ph.D. Karl travels whenever he can and preaches wherever he can. He is amazed daily by God's acceptance and is committed to communicating that grace to others.

Recalibrate

- In the story recorded in Luke 7:38-50, do you identify more with the pious Pharisee or the sinful woman? Explain.
- This story juxtaposes the external sins of the flesh (the woman) and the internal sins of the heart (Simon). How did Jesus deal with external sins versus internal sins? As a church, do we mirror the methods of Jesus or do we tend to obsess over sins of the flesh and give a pass on sins of the heart? How might this passage inform matters of church discipline?
- How can we cultivate a faith that is all about a love relationship with Jesus, rather than a checklist of rules? What have you found to be most helpful in nurturing a personal friendship with Jesus? How can we keep spirituality from growing stale?

The Forgotten Women of Galilee
Luke 8:1-3 (NIV)

Recalibrate

- What does this passage tell you about Jesus' attitude toward women?
- Does Jesus' practice as revealed in this passage surprise you? Shock you?
- What do you learn about the women disciples of Jesus?
- We commonly think of Mary of Magdala as having been a prostitute. Does Luke 8:1-3 challenge that idea?



BRANDY KIRSTEIN
David, Jesus, and the Question
Psalm 22:1–2 (NLT)

Brandy is a stay-at-home mom to her two little darlings—Jax and Scarlett. In her spare time, she works as a nurse and full-time doctoral

student for family nursing practice at Southern Adventist University. She lives in Collegedale, TN. Her passions include astronomy, reading, writing, teaching, painting, running, and healthy cooking. This year she is working on reading through all of the books of C.S. Lewis and painting one of her ceilings into a galaxy.

Recalibrate

- Are there parts of life that seem incomprehensible? How about your own life?
- What do you do with pain? How do you cope?
- Pretend the people at your table are not Christians and don't know words like grace, sin, and "great controversy." Discuss why there is suffering in the world. What does that reveal to us about God?



SAM LEONOR
Words Matter: Communicating in the Way of Jesus
John 13:33–35 (NLT)

Sam loves his work as chaplain to the students and faculty of La Sierra University. His ministry is marked by a call to radical faith in Jesus.

He loves finding ways to engage culture deeply for the sake of the Gospel. He has devoted his ministry to helping young adults bloom into a faith that is growing, full of love, and mission oriented.

Recalibrate

- What kind of people are the easiest and the hardest for you to have constructive dialogue with?
- What needs to change about how we (the church) communicate with each other?
- What are some ways we build (or injure) our credibility and witness by the way we talk with each other?
- How can we better solve (or live with) our differences through the way we communicate?



PADDY MCCOY
Less Is More: A Manifesto Off-Center
John 3: 27-30 (ESV)

Paddy wishes to be forever known as a follower of Jesus who did his best to believe in His steadfast love and faithfulness, all the while enjoying the blessings He's given. Paddy is blessed to be married to Tricia, to be a father to Ayden (16) and Allayna (13), and to have had the opportunity to serve in ministry with the One project, at Kettering College, at Walla Walla University, and at Kettering Adventist Church. He loves mentoring young adults in faith and leadership.

Recalibrate

- Our church in North America is not growing at the rate the early church did. Why isn't the body of Christ growing here and what must we do to grow healthier and stronger?
- What part of my life must I crucify in order to let Christ become greater?
- Why do we talk numbers and tithe more than life change and transformation?
- What ideas can you dream of that could help your church be more multi-generational, encouraging different generations to work hand-in-hand, side-by-side?
- Who in your life, right now, can you go back to your church and "Barnabas"?



CHRIS OBERG
Mary and Her Dead Friend, Lazarus
John 11:17-32 (CEB)

Chris serves at La Sierra University Church as the lead pastor. She values the opportunity to cultivate safe space to open scripture, voice questions, hear the Spirit, embrace the other and learn to dream God's dreams. Chris is a double-alumnus of La Sierra University H.M.S. Richards Divinity School. She most enjoys spending time with her young adult daughters, Amanda and Alisa, and spouse, Kerby. Travel, foodie-foods, books and the beach are among her favorite things.

Recalibrate

- The 19th-century hymn by Francis Crosby cries out to God, "While on others thou are calling, do not pass me by." Talk about the tension you experience when you see others receive miracles yet the mighty acts of God pass by you and yours.
- Miracle faith is living from one miracle to the next and considering these the optimum of our spiritual journey. How do we move beyond the miracle to the person of Jesus?
- Talk about Mary, about her temperament, her upbringing, her worldview, her culture, her community, and other factors that might have made her able to speak with forcefulness to Jesus. Do you relate to Mary's posture or do you find it offensive?
- Talk about what it means to make space in your tribe for all the characters in this story. It actually takes a community for healing to come. Reflect on this together.

The Ruler and the Thief
Luke 18:18–30 (NIV)
Luke 23:39–43 (NIV)

Randy is a disciple of Jesus, a husband, father, pastor and administrator. His family (wife Anita and children Austin and Miranda)

is the joy of his life! He pastors a church he dearly loves (Loma Linda University Church) and also works in an organization in which he deeply believes (Loma Linda University Health). - What good news do you hear from the thief on the cross?

Matthew 14:22–33

- Where in your life do you sense Jesus calling to you to step out of your "boat" and walk on the "water" with Him?




IKI TAIMI
