



Purse also. He once said, "Don't fail to do something just because you can't do everything." I know a couple from Virginia that live in Slovakia. They started a ministry in one of the cities there where they took over an old gym and turned it into a school for the Romany children. The education system of Slovakia still classifies Romany children as "special needs" and will not allow them to mainstream into regular education. They wish that they could fix the whole education system of Slovakia, but they can't. Did they come home because they can't fix the whole system? No, they decided they could at least do something for the children in that one area. So, they learned Slovak and the local Roma dialect and started a school for those that lived in the slum there. They can't educate every Romany child, but they can educate some.

When we look at magnitude of human suffering in our world today, we can get overwhelmed. But, we are not asked to help everybody at once. No one can possibly do this on their own. We are only asked to help one at a time. Jesus said in Matthew 25, "Whenever you have done it to the least of any of these...." You may have the means to help more than one at a time,
