

STRAIGHT FROM THE HART

Ministry Clarity Co-Directors, Chris Gleason and Kim Zwisdak, and their team (along with Consultant Rev. Billy Brath from LCEF) have led the congregation through a Ministry Clarity Process (strategic plan) designed to help our church and ministries come out strong after the pandemic.

We conclude our review of the "Mission Pillars," which are areas of stability that help hold up the mission. They are the solid foundation on which we wish to build.



Pillar #6: Social Ministry Acts of mercy are encouraged and offered collectively as a demonstration of Christ's love.

The story of Jesus feeding the 5,000 (Matthew 14:13-21; Mark 6:31-44; Luke 9:12-17; John 6:1-14) is a very important event in the life and ministry of our Savior. It is a simple story and yet quite profound. Jesus came to feed hungry souls

with God's grace, yet in compassion He also cared about hungry bellies (and all human needs). We can say with certainty that feeding the hungry helps them hear (and makes them more willing to engage) the message of the Gospel. There is more here, though. Recognizing and caring about the human needs around us shows a level of engagement that simply sharing doctrinal facts does not. How could people believe that Jesus cared for their souls if He ignored the human needs right in front of Him? Similarly, how can we desire to share our faith without also recognizing the human needs around us and actively working with our partners to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, care for the sick and visit the imprisoned? (Matthew 25:42).

The story also tells us that Jesus can take what little we have (time, resources, knowledge, talents, money) and use it to do amazing things. In some Gospel accounts, the miracle begins with a boy sharing his meager lunch and Jesus multiplying that to feed everyone. Sometimes we may question what impact we as individuals can make, or what we can do as a church community that would make a difference. Actually, our resources are great at VLC/TCS. And offered freely to Jesus and blessed by our Savior, they can indeed reap a bountiful harvest of people impacted with the Gospel in both body and soul. As we follow our Clarity Plan, consider how you will be a part of our social ministry efforts. How can you allow Jesus to bless our world through your life and our ministry? A thought about our sixth Mission Pillar and social ministry that is Straight from the Hart.

FOCUS ON WORSHIP

As we all know, February 2 is Groundhog Day in America. Its German roots are part of a long European church tradition known in English as Candlemas. The date was established because it is 40 days after Christmas, commemorating when Mary and Joseph went to the temple to fulfill the Jewish rituals of circumcision (Jesus) and purification (Mary). Luke's Gospel provides one last song about Jesus on this occasion, sung by Simeon and known as the *Nunc dimittis*.

Simeon may have been a priest, or possibly a prophet. Like Mary, Elizabeth and Zechariah, he was a faithful servant of God who became

filled with the Holy Spirit. His special promise was not a child of his own, but the privilege of seeing the Messiah in his lifetime. Simeon thus sings that he can "depart in peace" because the way of salvation was now a reality. Simeon's work of waiting, watching, and tending was over, but he rejoiced that the people after him would get to experience this fulfillment. Jesus, the Messiah, was to be a light to the world so that all people, including the Gentiles who had never known God, could see the true God.

Candlemas comes at roughly the midpoint between the winter solstice and the spring equinox. As the hours of darkness diminished, and in homage to the "light" of Simeon's song, people started having their home supply of candles blessed on this date. The groundhog part came later, as farmers speculated (ironically) that shadows cast by sunlight on Candlemas were a harbinger of more winter weather. I started a new tradition this year of placing electric candles in my windows during Advent. While they were supposed to last 30 days or so, they are still going strong as of this writing and I am hoping to keep the light shining long into Epiphany.

The *Nunc dimittus* (Latin for "Now dismiss") was always a familiar and comforting canticle. It served as the conclusion of the Communion service from TLH, and is now part of the funeral liturgy as well as the service of Compline (prayer at the close of the day). There is also the echo of Simeon in the way we end all of our services: "*Depart in peace*" (we have seen God through Word and Sacrament) "to serve the Lord" (like Simeon, we have been led to worship by the Holy Spirit; but the Spirit also goes with us into our daily activities). "Thanks be to God." The light still shines; God's glory is all around us if we only stop and look.

"Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, saying, 'Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him" (Matt. 2:1–2).

Ever wonder what would possess these strange figures called the Wise Men to traverse the countryside to bring gifts to a king that wasn't really theirs by law? The Magi give us an answer right in the words of their question to Herod and the religious leaders in Jerusalem. "For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." It was the star that pointed to the giving of the single greatest gift God has given to humanity.

The Wise Men didn't come because of a feeling in their gut. They didn't saddle up their camels because they got an invitation in the mail nor did they see a Facebook notification or Snapchat. It was the star that told them! Creation talks about the glory of God. This is exactly what the psalmist says, "The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork. Day to day pours out speech, and night to night reveals knowledge" (Psalms 19:1–2).

If the heavens can declare the handiwork of God because He made them, how about the simple gifts that the Lord has given you? The answer is yes! How one stewards the simple gifts our Lord bestows answers the question, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews?" When we are intentional in our stewardship of all God has given for the sake of the kingdom of God, we are pointing those around us to the King of Kings and Lord of Lords, Jesus Himself. However, if we claim ownership of God's creation, WE are claiming to be the king. Not only is this foolishness, it is idolatry!

Today, reflect on the way you manage the simple gifts our Lord has given you. Are you using them in a manner, which like the star of Bethlehem, points people to Jesus? If not, ask the Lord to forgive you and point you to the One who is born King of the Jews ... for He is YOUR king!

CONCORDIA LEGACY AT VLC



Concordia Legacy at VLC: At the closing of Concordia College, several items were designated to be transferred to the care and keeping of VLC and TCS. This month we're highlighting two tall brass candlesticks. Part of the legacy of Concordia College is the impact of faith in the life of the college, including worship experiences in and outside of the Chapel. These connections with God's Word helped shape the cultural worldview of thousands of students. This is one aspect of the college that many of us hold most dear. Although we anticipate this legacy to continue through the mission of Iona, the loss continues to be felt in heart and soul.

Two brass candlesticks that were used in holy worship at the college now grace the steps to our chancel. Although they are worn from faithful use and the inscriptions are faint to the eye, the oil candles continue to burn brightly. The gentle glow reminds us of the blessings of the Concordia faith community and lights the way for us to encourage our new partner, Iona College, in her mission to instill a "joy in lifelong learning" and the "enduring integration of mind, body and spirit." The candlesticks also remind us of our own ministry's birth from Concordia as the original chaplaincy of the college community over 100 years ago. Concordia's Latin motto was "Nisi Dominus Frustra" which translates, "Without God, [it is] in vain" and is based on Psalm 127 ("Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain.). The light of the candles reminds us of the Lord's work that was, is and will continue to be Concordia's legacy for years to come.
