Pillar #5: Evangelism



Opportunities to learn and demonstrate best practices to share our faith and to invite others to receive the faith are offered.

Have you ever had good news that you wanted to share? Perhaps it was a recipe that turned out delicious, a bargain at a local store, or a new

restaurant that was too great to miss. The natural urge is to share this news with a loved one.

Our faith is also good news—in fact, it's the best news of all!—and we want to share it. Jesus has won forgiveness for us through His life, death and resurrection, and He bestows this grace upon us freely through the Word and the Sacraments. These means of grace work faith in our hearts, and with faith we have the assurance of a new relationship with God that provides abundant life in this world and eternal life in heaven. And this good news is not just for us, but for the world. We can share it with all who do not know God or who currently have no relationship with God. But how?

Fear and uncertainty can lock up our good news and keep us from sharing as we naturally would. How can we share our faith without sounding judgmental? And what if people have questions about our faith that we don't know how to answer? This is why a pillar of our church is about evangelism and making sure we have the tools and resources to share our faith, whenever we feel led or have the opportunity.

Think about the people who shared the faith with you, and how thankful you are that they gave you this great gift. How joyous to be able to connect someone else with the love of Christ, or introduce them to a local church community where they can grow and worship!

ADULT BIBLE STUDY



FOCUS ON WORSHIP

Following the scene in Luke's Gospel where Mary and Elizabeth meet, we hear the end of the story about the birth of John the Baptist. Our attention is drawn back to Zechariah, who had been left mute but ends up singing another beautiful canticle known as the *Benedictus*.

Apparently, Zechariah the priest still had some things to learn about God. He could not quite accept the possibility of a miracle when Gabriel announced it, but by the time John was born, we can see that Zechariah was full of faith and wisdom. When he affirmed the name of his newborn son as John, in accordance with the Word of the Lord from Gabriel, Zechariah's temporary inability to speak was ended. He could not restrain himself from expressing praise to God and then

prophesying through the power of the Holy Spirit which had previously been given to Elizabeth.

The first part of the song (Luke 1:68-75) is filled with joy over the fulfillment of God's promise to send a redeemer. Zechariah now understands that the long-awaited descendant of David was arriving in the form of a child in Mary's womb, who had been living with him for the past three months. This child Jesus (meaning "The Lord saves") is called a "horn of salvation" – a gift of strength, of rescue, of protection. Zechariah further understands that God's covenant with Abraham was now coming to fruition: "I will surely bless you and make your descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as the sand on the seashore. Your descendants will take possession of the cities of their enemies, and through your offspring all nations on earth will be blessed." (Genesis 22:17-18)

In the second part of the song (verses 76-79), Zechariah sings tenderly to his son, John. He can see that John will "prepare the way" by making people aware that the Messiah has in fact arrived, and that salvation is to be accomplished through the forgiveness of sins. Zechariah concludes by making reference to the promise in Isaiah that God's glorious light of life will "shine on those living in darkness and in the shadow of death."

The *Benedictus* (Latin for "Praise be") is part of the Service of Morning Prayer, which we used to sing regularly in Concordia chapels. At first, I thought I would find it tiresome to sing the same thing every week; however, I found some new spark every time we sang it. God's tender mercy, the ability to serve Him without fear, the promise of forgiveness, the light in the darkness, the path of peace. It is a song that spreads the love and joy of this Epiphany season.

Praise be to the Lord, the God of Israel, because He has come and has redeemed His people.

"But earnestly desire the higher gifts. And I will show you a still more excellent way" (1 Cor. 12:31).

Higher gifts. More excellent way. These sound like comparatives. They are, if you are talking about us. But these words that the Holy Spirit gives to Paul are not about us. They are only and always about what He desires us to have!

The Lord wants you to know that your simple gifts are in no way simplistic. They are glory! But not your glory. They are His glory. If you read the entire chapter of 1 Corinthians 12 you see some fantastic gifts being called lower gifts. Healing. Tongues. Interpretation. These are all fantastic if you were to have them. It is hard to see any way in which these are lesser gifts.

That is until you read what the Lord desires as a higher gift. 1 Corinthians 13 talks about it. The higher gift is love! There is no greater gift than love. Jesus talks about that in John 15:13 when He says that "greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friend." This is the kind of love that we have been given. God loved the world so much that He gave us Jesus. Jesus loved us so much that He died and rose. There is no greater gift of love. Jesus says so!


And this greater love that God has given us in Jesus is an active love! It is given so that we can give it away. That is what our stewardship is all about. Giving freely of the greater love that we have been given!

CONCORDIA LEGACY AT VLC



At the closing of Concordia College, several items were designated to be transferred to the care and keeping of VLC and TCS. This month we're talking about the addition of original art. In 2012, VLC member and then President of Concordia College, Dr. Viji George, created a wonderful art exhibit and sale. According to publicity at the time, "Asia, and India in particular, has seen a dramatic growth of its Christian population. In fact, India has the largest Lutheran population in the non-western world. Art, music and liturgy in these regions have been indigenized over Christianity's longstanding presence."

With that understanding, President George, using his connections, brought a sampling of extraordinary Christian art from Indian artists. The artists represented in the collection were all rooted in Southern Indian artistic traditions and worked in a variety of mediums. They were well established in their setting and continue to have an ardent following. Several pieces remained at the College after the show and now adorn the eastern side of the VLC sanctuary. Beautiful and deeply moving, the art seems at home on the brick wall and is a faithful reminder of the global nature of the Christian Church, the Holy Spirit's work through the medium of fine art and the indelible legacy of President George in our community.












STAYING SAFE: Our love for neighbor, expressed by our working together to stop community spread of COVID-19, remains our goal for in-person worship. As a reminder to our community:
