

STRAIGHT FROM THE HART

Ministry Clarity Co-Directors, Chris Gleason and Kim Zwisdak, and their team (along with Consultant Rev. Billy Brath from LCEF), continue to lead the congregation through a Ministry Clarity Process (strategic plan) designed to help our church and ministries come out strong after the pandemic.

This fall we will be walking through the "Mission Pillars" of our plan. These are areas of stability that help hold up the mission and they are the solid foundation on which we wish to build.

Pillar #2 Worship: Through the Divine Service, personal and corporate prayer and Church Rites, we are brought to know Christ and know Christ deeper through the means of grace.

Going to church may mean different things to different people. For Village Lutheran Church, we hope to always understand it as the place God promises to meet us with His grace through His word and the Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper. The Word of God and the Sacraments were identified by Jesus as the way that He has chosen to work faith in our hearts. When we meet God, it is not because we make a personal decision to accept Him. Faith is not about getting information (as if knowing God was studying for a test). Once we hear God's Word, it often motivates us to commit or recommit our hearts to Him. We are eager to grow wiser in God's Word as we journey in life—these are the results of God working through His Word and the Sacraments. That's why our second pillar is such a strong foundation and motivation. It is also a challenge.

Modern trends in the USA reveal that people are spending less time in church than in the recent past. Busy lives and many demands make it difficult for many families and individuals. The pandemic has made this even more true as people (rightly so) have been reluctant to gather in person for fear of the disease. The pandemic will wane, and it is more important than ever to lift up this truth. Our worship needs to be accessible, encouraging and engaging, and we must invite and welcome newcomers to join us. We must also remember those who have been absent from worship, and invite them back to their church home. It's not about meeting numerical goals; it's about fulfilling the need that all people have to receive God's grace.

Imagine how weak a person would become from fasting from physical food for weeks on end. Pillar #2 reminds us that we also hunger for God's Word, and that a primary purpose of our ministry is to welcome hungry souls to be nourished through the Word, Baptism and the Lord's Table.

How might this pillar help you reflect on your worship life? How might it encourage you to invite a friend or colleague to worship? How might it motivate you to be a volunteer to assist in worship as a way of helping others receive God's Word and the Sacraments?

A thought about our second Mission Pillar that is Straight from the Hart.

FOCUS ON WORSHIP

October always sends my liturgical thoughts towards Lutheran history in the Reformation and especially the worship contributions of Martin Luther. His love of music and exploring the Bible created a legacy that resonate with me and which I am grateful we have. Luther created a number of hymns and canticles that are still familiar and in use. One that was added to Lutheran Service Book is a canticle I would like to have us become more familiar with: *Grant Peace, We Pray* (LSB 777 and 778)

The text for this canticle, as with many of Luther's verses, is adapted from ancient church liturgy and highly scriptural in essence. The first half of the prayer is a plea for peace: "Grant peace, we pray, in mercy, Lord; peace in our time, O send us!" One passage cited in LSB is 2 Thessalonians 3:16: *Now may the Lord of peace himself give you peace at all times and in every way.* Luther was living through some turbulent times, both politically and in the church. When confronted with turmoil like this, we pray to God for the true peace that only He can create for us.

The second half of the prayer looks to God as our defender in the face of any threat: "For there is none on earth but You, none other to defend us. You only, Lord, can fight for us." There are countless stories in the Old Testament of God fighting on behalf of the Israelites – just think of the walls of Jericho. We also know that the angels in heaven stand guard to fight our spiritual battles. Psalm 72:4 affirms that God will *defend the afflicted among the people and save the children of the needy; he will crush the oppressor*. Jesus has already won the battle (as we sing in "A Mighty Fortress"). We can put our trust in God for all of the challenges that come at us.

There are two melodies for us to sing this prayer. One tune was developed in Germany from a Gregorian chant, an arrangement of which was made for LSB by Carl Schalk (#778). Bach also wrote a chorale version of this tune. Felix Mendelssohn later wrote a hymn melody in the majestic key of E-flat major, which he utilized in a beautiful choral setting (one of our choir favorites). We will be learning that setting (LSB 777) this month. Now, as then, it is a good reminder that God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

"... so that through the church the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. This was according to the eternal purpose that He has realized in Christ Jesus our Lord, in whom we have boldness and access with confidence through our faith in Him" (Eph. 3:10-12).

What is the goal of our stewardship? This is really the WHY question of stewardship. Human beings were created for the task of being stewards. We see this in Genesis chapters one and two. In going to the cross, Jesus restores us in forgiveness to the task of once again stewarding what God has given us. Forgiven and restored in Jesus, we are once again stewards. Not just of creation, but of the Gospel as it is served by creation, including us!

Today we pray again that we would be able to recognize the simple gifts the Lord has given us to steward for the sake of the Gospel. In this we make known the manifold wisdom of God. As we faithfully steward the simple gifts God has entrusted to us, we point people to the through Jesus Christ. Remember, the world sees Jesus through your stewardship. What are you showing the world in how you steward God's simple gifts?

CONCORDIA LEGACY AT VLC

At the closing of Concordia College, several items were designated to be transferred to the care and keeping of VLC and TCS. This month we are highlighting the Concordia Cornerstone that was previously located in the circle drive in front of Feth Hall at Concordia College and has now been lovingly placed near the exit to the MAC lot on the northeast side of our VLC/TCS campus. The stone was found in Hawthorne, on the site of the location originally planned to be the permanent home of Concordia College. It was engraved with the year 1893, when Concordia Collegiate Institute (which became Concordia College) moved from New York City to Hawthorne. The cornerstone was crafted into a beautiful memorial of Concordia's history (with a handsome bronze plaque) by the Concordia Prep Class of 1956 at their 50th anniversary reunion. The relocation to our campus comes 15 years later, on the 65th anniversary of the class. Special thanks to Kenneth Werring and the Concordia Prep Class of 1956 for underwriting the cost of the move across White Plains Road to its new home. It is marked with a scripture passage that is fitting for the mission of Concordia and for the ministry of VLC/TCS: "I will teach you the good and the right way" (1 Samuel 12:23).

The Chapel School is thrilled to once again partner with the TCS New York City Marathon as an official charity partner.


