

STRAIGHT FROM THE HART

Village Lutheran Church and The Chapel School community has expressed great love and prayers for my brother, Benjamin, who passed away on April 27th after a courageous health battle over the last year. Although he received a successful liver transplant in the fall of 2021, he suffered complications that compromised his health and ultimately took his life at just 61. Like most families that go through a stressful and traumatic illness of a loved one, we don't understand why, but we are grateful for the many kindnesses along the way.

Benny is my older brother. I have an older sister, Beverly (the middle child) and I am the "baby" of the family. Benny was the leader (and sometimes tyrant) of our sibling band. When he wasn't tormenting us, we looked to him for guidance and really leaned on his insight and wisdom. He was always deeply philosophical and academic in his thinking, and this love of the pursuit of wisdom turned toward faith in God and the power of prayer as he struggled. Having so much taken from him gave him deeper insight unto the rich tapestry of faith. For instance, he received a prayer shawl from our Prayer Shawl Ministry, and he really was comforted that this soft blue blanket came with our prayers and God's blessing. He often draped it over his shoulders and even in the last days clung to the shawl and the hope and strength it provided. My family and I are so grateful for the love and support showered on us during this difficult time.

Now comes the hardest moments of grief. Football in the fall will remind me of his passion for sports (he was a season ticket holder for the Colts for many years). Only the unrequited love of my Jets will distract me from sorrow when football season begins. The Jets bring their own sorrows. I also know that I will repeatedly feel that pang of loss. Already I have had the fleeting thought to call my brother, only to remember that he has passed. And holidays and birthdays will seem a little empty this year as we keenly feel his absence.

However, amid the grieving, the love of a Christian community will continue, and the Christian Gospel of hope remains. "Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me / All the days of my life; / And I will dwell in the house of the Lord / Forever." I prayed those comforting verses of Psalm 23 at his beside and I believe my gentle shepherd is keeping Benny in His grace and care. What a blessing and comfort. A thought about grief and loss that is Straight from the Hart.



FOCUS ON WORSHIP

Probably the grandest canticle of the Church is the *Te Deum*. Dating back to the beginning of the 5th century, it is a three-part hymn of praise written originally in Latin and known by the first line of the text: *Te Deum laudamus* (We praise Thee, O God). Musical settings range all the way from chant form to hymnic paraphrase to oratorio.

Liturgically, the *Te Deum* is found in the Service of Morning Prayer (Matins). As with the *Gloria*, there is a Trinitarian thread running through the text. The opening verses are extravagant expressions of praise addressed to God the Father. No doubt inspired by the visions in Revelation, the poetry sings of faithful followers in heaven such as angels, apostles, prophets and martyrs, as well as the Church on earth. In the center of that section is a repeat of the "Holy, Holy, Holy" we find in the Sanctus.

The middle section is addressed to God the Son, possibly inspired by Paul's hymn in chapter 2 of Philippians and including elements of the Creed. In musical settings, the drama is often highlighted by using quiet or even minor-mode passages for the images of Christ coming to earth and suffering death on our behalf. This leads back to ebullient songs of praise as Christ is seen at the right hand of the Father.

The final section is a prayer consisting entirely of familiar lines from the Psalms. Having contemplated the glory and majesty of our God and His plan of salvation, we place ourselves in God's care and affirm our trust: *Save Your people, O Lord, and bless Your inheritance* (Psalm 28:9); *Have mercy on us, O Lord, have mercy on us* (Psalm 123:3); *In Thee, O Lord, have I trusted; let me never be confounded* (Psalm 34:22).

We have two chant settings in the LSB liturgies and two hymn paraphrases. The most familiar is "Holy God, We Praise Thy Name" (LSB 940). A newer setting is "We Praise You and Acknowledge You, O God" (LSB 941), based on a noble melodic theme from Gustav Holst's "The Planets." Another familiar musical piece inspired by this text is a symphonic Prelude to the Te Deum composed by Marc-Antoine Charpentier (look it up, and I think you'll recognize it from graduations and other ceremonies). What a superb way to sing God's praise!
