# Body Building Gracism: The Art of Loving those you may not Like 1 Corinthians 12:21-26

America has a problem: <u>Division</u> – We have an <u>ism</u> problem.

**Racism:** speaking, acting or thinking negatively about someone else solely based on that person's color class or culture.

Gracism: (unmerited Favor) positive extension of favor on other humans based on color, class, culture, or ideology.

#### **How To Become a Gracist?**

- 1. I Need You.
- 2. I will Honor and Respect You.

Agreeing ≠ Respecting

3. I will Love and Care for you.
