Resurrection Hope for Today!

Luke 24:36-52

Biblical Hope – *confident trust in the God of resurrection power no matter what.*

How the Resurrection of Jesus Gives us Hope for Today. (Luke 24:36-49)

1. Suffering Has a Purpose. (vv. 45-47)

²⁸ And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose. (Romans 8:28)

2. We have Power for Today. (vv. 48-49)

I want you to realize what a rich and glorious inheritance he has given to his people. I pray that you will begin to understand the incredible greatness of his power **for us** who believe in him. This is the same mighty power that raised Christ from the dead. (Ephesians 1:18-19)

3. We have eternal hope. (vv. 37-39)

No I has ever seen, no ear has ever heard, and no mind has ever imagined, the wonderful things that God has prepared for those who love him! (1 Corinthians 2:9)
