Martin Luther "I would have those who are to be baptized to be entirely immersed, as the word imports and the mystery signifies."

John Calvin "The word 'Baptize' signifies to immerse. It is certain that immersion was the practice of the ancient church."

John Wesley "Buried with him, alludes to baptizing by immersion according to the custom of the first church."

At The Vineyard, we teach and encourage every participant to be baptized the way Jesus demonstrated, even though many of us were "confirmed" as children.

5. WHEN SHOULD I BE BAPTIZED?

A. AS SOON AS YOU HAVE BELIEVED!

Those who believed . . . were baptized and added to the church that day!

THERE IS NO REASON TO DELAY. AS SOON AS YOU HAVE DECIDED TO RECEIVE CHRIST INTO YOUR LIFE, YOU CAN AND SHOULD BE BAPTIZED. IF YOU WAIT UNTIL YOU ARE "PERFECT," YOU'LL NEVER **FEEL "GOOD ENOUGH!"**

Frequently Asked Questions **About Baptism**

1. HOW OLD MUST A PERSON BE TO BE BAPTIZED?

Only a sincere and well-informed profession of faith is necessary. At the Vineyard, we wait until our children are old enough to believe, understand and articulate their faith before we baptize them.

Some denominations christen infants; however, it is our conviction, based on Biblical instruction and practice, that baptism is reserved for professing followers of Jesus. Baby baptism and child dedication should be kept as two distinct practices. The Vineyard offers child dedication which is a confirmation between the parents and the church that each will do their part to see the child discover and fulfill God's unique purpose for his or her life.

2. DO I HAVE TO BE RE-BAPTIZED AT THE VINEYARD?

No. The only Biblical test for a "genuine" baptism is the faith of the believer being baptized. It is a covenant between Jesus and the believer, not an initiation ritual to a particular denomination or fellowship.

3. CAN MY FAMILY BE BAPTIZED TOGETHER?

Yes! If each family member understands fully the meaning of baptism, and each one has personally placed his/her trust in Christ for salvation, we encourage families to be baptized at the same time. It is a wonderful expression of commitment. Young children who wish to be baptized should discuss the matter carefully with their parents and a pastor.

HOWEVER, it is important to remember that baptism is a personal statement of faith, not a family tradition. It is usually not wise to delay your baptism while waiting on other family members to accept Christ, particularly children. This puts an undue pressure on them, and delays your obedience.

4. WHAT SHOULD I WEAR WHEN I AM BAPTIZED?

Clothes that will not retain much water work best. Most people wear dark-colored shorts and t-shirts. Also, make sure to bring a change of clothes, two towels and a plastic bag for wet clothing.

The Meaning Of Communion

Jesus never asked his disciples to remember his birth, but he did instruct them to remember his death and resurrection. He gave the church two visible symbols (called ordinances or sacraments) as reminders of his death. There is **BAPTISM** and **COMMUNION**, also called the Lord's Supper. Communion is an object lesson that represents a great spiritual truth for believers.

4. SOME WAYS WE TAKE COMMUNION:

Different churches have differing traditions for taking the Lord's Supper. The Bible does not spell out exact details on how communion is to be done; rather the emphasis is on why, and matters of the heart. Here at VCC, we celebrate communion in a variety of ways and settings.

WEEKEND CELEBRATIONS:

Communion is available outside the Prayer Room every weekend. On occasion, we will also include communion as part of the weekend celebration when the subject of the message lends itself to communion.

LIFE GROUPS:

Some Life Groups also choose to share communion together.

The Essentials We Believe

WE BELIEVE THAT THERE IS ONE LIVING AND TRUE GOD, eternally existing in three persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, equal in power and glory; that this triune God created all, upholds all, and governs all.

WE BELIEVE THAT THE SCRIPTURES OF THE OLD AND NEW TESTAMENTS ARE THE WORD OF GOD, fully inspired, without error in the original manuscripts, and the infallible rule of faith and practice.

WE BELIEVE IN GOD THE FATHER, AN INFINITE, PERSONAL SPIRIT, PERFECT IN HOLINESS, WISDOM, POWER, AND LOVE; that He concerns himself mercifully in the affairs of men; that He hears and answers prayer; and that He saves from sin and death all who come to him through Jesus Christ.

WE BELIEVE IN JESUS CHRIST, GOD'S ONLY BEGOTTEN SON, CONCEIVED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT. We believe in His virgin birth, sinless life, miracles, and teaching; His substitutionary atoning death, bodily resurrection, ascension into heaven, perpetual intercession for His people, and personal, visible return to earth. We believe, at His first coming, Jesus inaugurated the fulfillment of the Kingdom of God.

WE BELIEVE IN THE HOLY SPIRIT, Who came forth from the Father and Son to convict the world of sin, righteousness, and judgment, and to regenerate, sanctify and empower for ministry all who believe in Christ; we believe the Holy Spirit indwells every believer in Jesus Christ and that He is an abiding Helper, Teacher, and Guide. We believe in the present ministry of the Holy Spirit and in the exercise of all the Biblical gifts of the Spirit.

WE BELIEVE THAT ALL PEOPLE ARE SINNERS BY NATURE AND CHOICE AND ARE THEREFORE UNDER CONDEMNATION, God regenerates and baptizes by the Holy Spirit those who repent of their sins and confess Jesus Christ as Lord.

WE BELIEVE IN THE UNIVERSAL CHURCH, the living spiritual body, of which Christ is the Head and all regenerated persons are members.

WE BELIEVE THAT THE LORD JESUS CHRIST COMMITTED TWO **ORDINANCES TO THE CHURCH:** baptism and communion. We believe in water baptism and communion open to all believers.

WE BELIEVE ALSO IN THE LAYING ON OF HANDS FOR THE **EMPOWERING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT,** for ordination of pastors and elders. for receiving gifts of the Spirit, and for healing.

WE BELIEVE IN THE PERSONAL, VISIBLE, APPEARING OF CHRIST TO **EARTH AND THE CONSUMMATION OF HIS KINGDOM;** in the resurrection of the body, the final judgment, and eternal blessing of the righteous and endless suffering of the wicked.

WE BELIEVE IN WHAT IS TERMED "THE APOSTLE'S CREED" as embodying fundamental facts of Christian faith, and endorse the historic orthodox creeds of the church.

The Apostle's Creed

I believe in God the Father, Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth—and in Jesus Christ, His only begotten Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate; and was crucified, dead and buried. He descended into hell, on the third day He rose again from the dead and He ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. He shall come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit. I believe in the universal church and the communion of saints. I believe in the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Our Lifestyle Statement

(WHAT WE PRACTICE)

Few would disagree that our beliefs must be translated into action if they are to have an impact on our lives. Based on our belief in what the Bible teaches, we feel the following seven practices should be a part of our day-to-day lifestyle:

LIVING THE BIBLE

We believe that the Bible is the word of God, inspired by Him and written down to draw us into a personal relationship with God through Jesus Christ, and to teach us how to live according to God's standards and purposes. The Bible explains that to be a true Christian, we must know God's word and do what it tells us to do. (John 5:39-40; 2 Timothy 3:15-16) In other words, we must live the Bible. As the Apostle Paul said:

All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right.

2 TIMOTHY 3:16 (NLT)

PRAYER

We believe that prayer – direct, personal, two-way communication with God – is an essential part of our understanding of and relationship with Him. Just as Jesus said that He only did what he saw God doing (John 5:19), we regularly must talk with God to know His will for our lives. When we pray, God guides us through the Holy Spirit and by the knowledge that only comes from Him.

WORSHIP

We believe that worshiping God is the highest privilege Christians have, allowing us to express our love for God with our whole heart, soul, mind and strength—as Jesus encouraged us to do in Mark 12:30—and bringing us into an intimate relationship with Him. Worshiping God through song is one of many ways that we do that. True worship is any act that shows God our love for Him, our dependence on Him and our trust in Him. God is worthy of our worship and desires it at all times.

GIVING

We believe that we become closer to God as we give. God is a giver. He gave His only Son as a sacrifice to show His love for us (John 3:16). Jesus said that He came to give His life away (Matthew 20:28). The Apostle Paul said that the test of our worship is our willingness to give our lives to God as living sacrifices (Romans 12:1). The Christian lifestyle requires that we give our time, energy and resources to God for Him to control. We give our time to God by structuring our lives around prayer, Bible study, ministry and other things that strengthen our relationship with Him. We give our energy by making ourselves available to be used by God for His purposes. We give our resources to God by presenting our tithes and offerings to His church and allowing him to use our possessions for His purposes.

SPIRIT-LED LIVING

We believe that it is impossible to live a Christian lifestyle without the power and leading of the Spirit of God. Therefore we strive to live Spirit-led lives, relying on God to guide us and depending on His power to enable us to live by His standards. (Philippians 2:13; Ephesians 5:18)

SHARING CHRIST WITH OTHERS

We believe that God has called all Christians to share the story of Jesus Christ—how he came, died and rose again to make a way for us to be forgiven and reconciled with God—with the people in our lives. This can be done in many ways, such as giving away a free coke at an intersection, inviting a friend to attend church, and telling others about our personal experience with Jesus Christ.

SHARING OUR LIVES


We believe that dynamic relationships with other Christians are a vital part of the Christian lifestyle. By regularly meeting in small groups we seek to establish relationships in which we play, pray, serve, laugh, cry, and grow together in a way that is not possible during our "large group" meetings. The Bible models small groups as a place for Christians to worship God, learn the Bible, pray together and grow spiritually as well as influence their community as a group. VCC has many small groups that offer a "place to belong" in the church.

WHAT IT MEANS TO BECOME A COMMITED MEMBER

At Vineyard Community Church we recognize the value of making a formal commitment. We ask you to commit to Vineyard Community Church for 4 reasons:

1. A BIBLICAL REASON: CHRIST IS COMMITED TO THE CHURCH.

Christ loved the church and gave his life for it. **EPHESIANS 5:25**_B **(GNT)**

2. A CULTURAL REASON: IT IS A WITNESS TO OUR COMMUNITY.

We live in an age where very few want to be committed to anything—a job, a marriage, our country. This attitude has also produced a generation of church shoppers and church hoppers. Commitment swims against the current of America's "consumer religion." It is an unselfish decision. Commitment always builds character.

3. A PRACTICAL REASON: IT DEFINES WHO CAN BE COUNTED ON.

Every team has a player roster. Every school has a student enrollment. Every business has an employee payroll. Every army has an enlistment of soldiers. Commitment identifies our family.

4. A PERSONAL REASON: IT PRODUCES SPIRITUAL GROWTH.

The New Testament places a major emphasis on the need for Christians to be accountable to each other for spiritual growth. You cannot be accountable when you're not committed to any specific church family.

WHAT IS EXPECTED OF MEMBERS?

At The Vineyard we never ask members to do more than the Bible clearly teaches. We only expect you to do what the Bible expects every Christian to do. These responsibilities are spelled out in the **MEMBER'S** COMMITMENT


