Opportunities are everywhere, Let's take advantage of as many as we can, while we still have them.

When a pastor first comes to a church, they take the tour. And as they pass through, they make mental notes, places to come back to in that first few days. Some places on that list will need repair, replacement, or TLC

But there are other places, Sacred places, where she or he sees a new thing, a potential for what is not yet.... But something that could be.... And it could be grand.... If only you could see what we see, when we see a church through new eyes.

Over the course of that first year, the common practice is to just observe, and not make changes. What if we just stopped, every time we just got a bit tired, got a bit frustrated, a bit whatever. We stopped seeing failure as a road to success.

I wish you could see the church through my eyes during this time. The absolute beauty of the sheer untapped potential of this church. I am so very excited to be a part of your church during this season. As scary as it might seem, the fields are ripe for harvest, and if we can find the workers, we can truly help to be the community of faith for so many people who just needed to be asked. Investing in them, is an investment in our future.

Before I came, I planned on observing for a while, only making changes where I absolutely had to, but as I listened to more and more of you, I began to sense a hunger for a few changes here and there. What started out as a few changes, has grown, and it is exciting to see how supportive you have been with every new change.



Many of the next changes that we will be implementing will be behind the scenes, strengthening our internal infrastructure and processes so that we can communicate more effectively both within the church and out in the community.

Some upcoming changes will be around removing barriers to worship and becoming intentional about welcoming guests and connecting them to other people and ministries within the church; there's a reason a rope is made of many strings.

I have recently heard of the plans around updating the space we worship in currently and think it is a great first step in getting ready to provide the best possible worship experience for people whether they are in-person or watching at home.
