Hope in action. Think of people in your life, community, or school that might need hope. How can you help them know that Jesus brings hope to the world?

Pray. God, we are so grateful that you give us hope! Thank you for not leaving us in the dark. Thank you for sending Jesus to be the light in our darkness. Fill our hearts with hope this Advent season and help us to be a light and hope to the people around us. Amen!

LIGHT THE CANDLE OF PEACE

Read. Isaiah 53:5, Luke 2:13-14, Philippians 4:7-8

Sing. O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

Talk it over. What is peace? What does it feel like? Have you ever prayed to ask God for peace when you were in a tough situation?

Peace in action. Think of someone in your life who needs more peace. How can you share the peace of Christ with them?

Pray. God, we are so grateful for the peace we have in you! We know that true peace is only found in you, would you make us instruments of your peace to a world that needs it? Help us to be peacemakers in our homes and communities.

LIGHT THE CANDLE OF LOVE

Tonight we light the candle of love, may we be overwhelmed by the love of God. Let us be people who show love to everyone around us. Let love light the way.

Reflect. What do you think of when you hear the word love? Paul describes love as patient, kind, rejoices over truth, always protects, always trusts, and always perseveres." Jesus showed us what it looked like to live a life of love, to lay down our lives for the people around us. We can love others because Jesus first loved us. What love we have been shown!

Read. Ephesians 2:1-9, 1 John 3:1

Sing. Lo, How a Rose E'e Blooming

Talk it over. What does it mean that God shows us love? How can we show love to others?

Love in action. Can you think of someone who needs to feel love? Someone who might need to feel God's love this season? Pick a way to show love to someone this week!

Pray. God we are so grateful for your deep, rescuing love for us. Thank you for loving us so much that you sent your son Jesus so that we would never walk alone. Thank you Jesus for showing us what it looks like to live in love. God, fill us with your love and help us to love others the way you love us! Amen.

LIGHT THE CANDLE OF JOY

Tonight we light the candle of joy. Joy cannot be purchased or wrapped. God, renew us with your spirit. Let joy light the way.

Reflect. What does joy mean? Joy is a gladness that comes from God no matter what happens in our ives. Joy comes from being with God, which means that we can be joyful even in unhappy moments. We can hold on to God's promise of "great joy" that would come when he sent his son Jesus to bring us life. We can also share this good news of great joy with everyone who needs to know the joy that Jesus promises!

Read. Matthew 2:10-11, Luke 2:7-15

Sing. Joy to the World, the Lord is Come!

Talk it over. After you read Luke 2, think about what the shepherds felt like. Where did their joy come from? What do you think it felt like when the angels appeared? When have you experienced joy?

Joy in action. Can you think of someone who needs to know joy? How can you share your joy with them this week?

Pray. God we are so grateful for the unspeakable joy we have in you! Tonight we rejoice when we think about how you came to be with us. We pray that we would find joy in you that would give us strength no matter what we experience, and that it would bubble up so that others might experience it!

Pray. Jesus, light of the world, you are here! We are full of celebration and praise! Thank you for coming to shine in the darkness. Because of you we can have hope, love, joy, and peace. Help us to give those things away to others!

Dear friend.


