1. Someone read **Romans 3:23**

2. Spend some time and read all of **Luke 15**.
 - Pastor Scott mentioned GAP(S) over and over again in the sermon. What does GAP represent?
 - In **Luke 15**, who bridged the gap between the sheep and the shepherd? The woman and the coin? The son and the dad?
 - Why do you think Jesus wants to make it very clear (**Luke 15:2**) that he is the only one who can bridge the gap between peoples sins and their relationship with God?
3. There are usually two types of people. 1). Those who spend a lot of time trying to deny their GAPS, or at least, hide them, and 2). there are those who will become obsessed with their GAPS and the agenda of their lives is to try to fix it.  - Why do Christians think it is their responsibility to call out other people's GAPS? Where have we seen this the most in this polarizing culture we live in today?
5. How are you the sheep in **Luke 15**? Spend some time explaining this to your group.

6. How are you the lost coin in **Luke 15**? Spend some time explaining this to your group.
7. How are you the prodigal son in **Luke 15**? Spend some time explaining this to your group?
8. Explain how **Luke 15** is all about Jesus' grace.
9. Someone read **2 Corinthians 12: 7-10**.
 - How does this verse help us when we think of our GAPS?
 - How does the Grace of Jesus make us stronger when we do have GAPS?
