Over 4.5 million public school students in Ukraine and 100,000 Muslim refugees have received God's Word and the numbers are still growing! As followers of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, we at EEM share God's Word with the people of Eastern Europe and beyond, seeking to educate and inspire God's servants everywhere to partner with us in His ministry.

EEM's faithful commitment to its prayer-centered and God-directed mission has sprouted long-term relationships with a multitude of ministry partners, which include local churches, campaign groups, youth camps, public schools and universities, public libraries, hospitals, prisons and orphanages.

Partnership is at the heart of everything we do at EEM. Both financial partners and distribution partners are vital components of our efforts to get Bibles into the hands of people in Eastern Europe. Whether its partnership through sharing personal resources or collaboration through global distribution of our materials in ministry, both play essential roles in the continuation of providing millions of people access to God's Word.

Our ministry is composed of a global network of passionate Christian leaders and ministers who work tirelessly to ensure that the Bibles and Bible-based materials we provide find a place in people's lives. We are always overjoyed to hear about how God's Word is transforming lives and inspiring others to do good, may it be better performances and behavior of young students in school, or bringing outreach activities to the poor in remote villages.

Along with growing demand for Bibles in public schools throughout Eastern Europe, for the first time ever, in 2016 EEM provided Bibles in Arabic and Farsi to refugees flooding into Europe along the refugee highway into Greece and other countries in Central Europe. It seemed God was using the turbulence in the Middle East to create a unique window of opportunity to share the Gospel with people groups who had been enslaved in Islamic influence for generations.

Thank you for joining us in this Kingdom ministry that is introducing so many people to Jesus Christ and the eternal salvation available to all.

Story of Hope

Estera Pogacnik, EEM's key contact in Slovenia, shared an amazing story from her church in Nove Mesto, Slovenia, near the Croatian border.

When things started to shut down due to the COVID-19 pandemic in Slovenia, Estera's church decided to spend a week in prayer and fasting for Slovenia and all the other countries in the world affected by the pandemic. They also did this to discern how they could continue to share the gospel in this new situation.

During one of the meetings, a neighbor called the police. The neighbor was under the impression that religious meetings were banned even though, at that point, they were not. The police came to check out what was going on and Estera's group leaders, Dennis & Milena Turk, explained what they were doing. They also shared the gospel with the two officers and offered each of them a Christian book. One of the officers accepted the book and later called Dennis back and said he wanted to give his life to Christ and study the Bible more!

While the police were still at their house, a reporter for an online news organization who happens to live in the neighborhood saw the police cars and came to check things out. He thought it was a burglary. He asked them what was going on and Dennis and Milena were able to share the gospel with him as he interviewed them. He then published an article titled "*From the Police to the Blessing*" and included the video of Dennis sharing the Gospel with him!

Though times are certainly challenging due to COVID-19, it is encouraging to see how Christians and churches respond with faith and try to do what they can to share God's loving message.
