Mission Moment - Melissa & David Raube - with Tyndale Translators in Philippines

RAUBE REPORT—MARCH 2020 (received on March 15, 2020)

OUTDOOR EDUCATION-

SO MUCH LEARNING AND PLAYING AND WORSHIPING!

David was involved as a Squad Leader for a group of 10 boys during Outdoor Ed. It was a 4-day week full of adventure. Some of the highlights included visiting a local organic farm, hike to a waterfall, spiritual refreshment, and the times spent around the camp during free time building relationships with one another. Many of David's squad boys shared that they enjoyed the worship times and messages they heard from the speaker, causing them to stand up and recommit their lives to Jesus Christ.

Also, each group was able to participate in a ministry day in which we opened the camp to children of displaced families as a result of the recent volcanic eruption of Taal. Our students spent their afternoon time with these local children playing with them and demonstrating God's love. We finished off the afternoon by singing songs, sharing a Bible story and gospel message. For some of Faith Academy middle school students, this was their first experience being involved in personal ministry.

WHAT IS HAPPENING IN THE PHILIPPINES?

Here is our update about Metro Manila area, and how is Faith Academy responding at this time.

President Rodrigo Duterte has announced a memorandum for minimizing the spread of COVID-19. Many media outlets quickly gave the name "lockdown" to the memorandum because of its stringent guidelines which, in summary, include:

All classes and school activities suspended, and except for cargoes, all travel into, out of or through Metro Manila area is restricted until April 14.

Faith Academy is located in Cainta, which is adjacent to Metro Manila. Technically, Faith Academy would be exempt from the Metro Manila restrictions except for the fact that many of our students commute from the Metro Manila area every day. Also, Cainta has imposed its own travel restrictions to the extent that no one is allowed travel in, out or through Cainta, except for employment reasons. Regardless, as a school we want to do our part in complying with governmental authorities the best that we can in order to help prevent the spread of COVID-19. The governmentimposed guidelines will initially remain in effect until April 14th.

We live in Antipolo City, adjacent to Cainta and approximately 4 miles outside the Metro Manila boundary. When/if we travel to Faith Academy, we have to show our Faith Academy identification card at checkpoints.

Because of these restrictions, as well as many other reasons, the Administration at Faith Academy is closing the school campus. We will be using our regular scheduled Spring Break (March 15-21) to figure out how to continue giving academic instruction to our students in an online format. The school will be holding two In-service days prior to March 25th. We will use those days to focus on how to facilitate online learning. We will discuss how to prioritize work for students and how to keep parents in the loop.

As you pray, please remember the staff and students at Faith Academy as we respond to the COVID-19 pandemic in a way that is reasonable and Christlike.

ABW Bible Book of the Month—Zephaniah

Purpose: To announce and explain the coming Day of the Lord to the people of God.

When will God act? Why does He take so long to bless, to judge, to heal, and to change us? He's God - so why should He wait for a certain "Day of the Lord" to fix things? Questions like these have always puzzled God's

people, but the principles in Zephaniah give us some answers.

Zephaniah prophesied during the reign of the godly King Josiah of Judah (640-609 BC). Josiah introduced a number of reforms in Judah, but the nation had been led for fifty-five years by two of its most evil kings, Manasseh and Amon, and the people had followed their wickedness. As a result, Zephaniah brought the dual message of the prophets: judgment followed by salvation and restoration.

The focus of Zephaniah's message was the coming Day of the Lord, when Judah and the wicked nations that surrounded it would be judged. After that judgment, however,



Judah would be restored to favor and blessing from the Lord. Just as some aspects of the judgment could be affected by repentance (2:1-3), some aspects of the restoration could be mitigated by faithlessness (Leviticus 26; Deuteronomy 28). But in the end, God would make certain that His holy people and His holy places were saved from their enemies and their own sin (Zephaniah 3:9-20).

The entire Bible in a year, chronologically, but three days of Old Testament followed by one day of New Testament, all year. The four gospels are intermingled to recount the whole story just once, in 4-fold detail. The Psalms of David are mixed in with David's history. The prophets are mixed in with the historical accounts during which they prophesied. Paul's epistles are mixed in with the accounts of his travels in Acts. SUNSHINE MEATLOAF

from the kitchen of Gene Hook (Joann's mother)

Meatloaf Ingredients:

2 eggs

3/4 cup milk

2 tsp Worcestershire 1/4 tsp black pepper

2 tsp salt

1 1/2 cups bread crumbs

½ cup chopped onion (may sauté first)

1 cup carrots, shredded (optional)

2 lb lean ground beef

Topping Ingredients:

2 Tbsp brown sugar

2 Tbsp prepared mustard

¹/₃ cup ketchup

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°; will need 2 (5x9) loaf pans.
- 2. Beat eggs; stir in milk, Worcestershire, pepper, & salt.
- 3. Add bread crumbs, carrots, & onion to mixture & mix thoroughly.
- 4. Add beef, mixing with your hands into mixture.
- 5. Shape into two loaves; place in loaf pans.
- In a small bowl, mix completely topping ingredients; brush over top of meatloaves.
- 7. Bake 1 hour.
