

The Family of Scot Morgan






The Bible Speaks of Love

SUGAR FREE CARROT CAKE MUFFINS

from the kitchen of Joann Hook

1 sugar free yellow cake mix

- 1 sugar free vanilla instant pudding
- 2 Tbsp sugar substitute (I use Truvia)
- 21/2 tsp ground cinnamon
- 4 eggs, whipped
- ¾ cup water
- 34 cup vegetable oil
- 3 cups carrots, grated chopped pecans, optional

Preheat oven to 325°; line muffin tin with cupcake liners.

In a mixing bowl, use a whisk to combine cake mix, pudding mix, sugar substitute, and cinnamon.

In another bowl, mix together eggs, water, and oil.

Add half of dry ingredients to the egg mixture, stirring gently to blend; add rest of dry ingredients, mixing until blended.

Fold in nuts, if using.

Fill muffin tins ¾ full; bake 35-40 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean.

Cool before serving or frosting with a sugar free frosting; since these are muffins, there is no need to frost.

ABW Bible Book of the Month Philemon

Purpose: To provide a model of how the gospel can restore broken relationships.

How do you get past the wall? Someone offends us—whether intentionally or not—and we allow a wall to be built up against that person. Unless we deal with the problem and seek reconciliation, we might end up regarding someone we once considered a close friend as an enemy. Those who follow Jesus are supposed to live in love with one another, but too often we choose our own way and allow differences to come between us. Life in Paul's day was no different.

Onesimus was a runaway slave. Such a crime was punishable by death. Paul wanted to see Philemon reconciled with Onesimus because now everything had changed—Onesimus had become a Christian.

One of Paul's most personal letters, the intended purpose is to create a situation where Philemon would be moved, due to Paul's gentle prodding, to welcome back his runaway slave Onesimus as a brother in the Lord (1:17) - and not have him executed.





Laura & David Parajon -ABC Global Servants in New Mexico & Nicaragua


We are thankful for you and all the ways in which you have touched our lives and the lives of people in Nicaragua. While Laura and I have been spending most of our time in New Mexico, we have been trying to do what we can to help our aging parents at a distance by plane or by Zoom. Our daughter Cristina moved from New York and got a job here, Scotty is a college senior and David is a sophomore in NY.



Your missionary support to IM is helping to save lives. Aura Rivera is health promoter in Tapasle, Matagalpa, Nicaragua and shared this story: "I got an emergency call. They were asking me to go visit a 3-yr-old boy who had diarrhea and fever. Neymar lives with his parents and 2 older siblings an hour away from the community clinic. It's a difficult path to walk to the house. When I arrived at the house, they informed me Neymar had been sick for a day. After examining him I gave him oral rehydration salts, acetaminophen and zinc tablets for the diarrhea. I visited them for 3 days to check on Neymar's progress. Thanks to God he got better!"

As an AMOS board member, I am thrilled that we finalized a Strategic Plan with an exciting vision for the next 3 years. AMOS plans to expand to 5 more rural communities, work with government and medical schools to train doctors and nurses and keep on partnering with churches to improve health.

This year will be my final year serving as an IM missionary and Christy Lafferty will be supporting the AMOS ministry as a new Global Servant with International Ministries.
