Two schools of thought emerge each January as we embark on the new year. The first dutifully plans and prepares resolutions in hopes of making this year a



better one than the last. The second shuns this process completely citing past failures or what they might refer to as "learning from other's mistakes." The latter attitude is understandable when we note research shows only a dismal 7% of those who make resolutions actually keep them.

Perhaps it's the way we make resolutions. Jonathan Edwards, one of history's greatest thinkers, at age nineteen made a list of seventy priorities and principles to guide his life. The actual priorities are not as significant for us as the words he used to preface them.

"Being sensible that I am unable to do anything without God's help, I do humbly entreat Him by His grace to enable me to keep these resolutions, so far as they are agreeable to His will, for Christ's sake."

His resolutions are achievable because they are:

- Sensible: Not sweeping change for sinless perfection, but in accordance to God's word
- Dependent on God's help: Any attempt for change on one's own is short lived at best. God is the right coach for life-long change
- Humble: Change not for my personal satisfaction or desire to boast in my success, but for the desire to please my Heavenly Father and honor Him in all I do
- Submissive to God's will for Christ's sake: Making changes as God shows me, even when it is hard, for the glory of His Son, Jesus Christ

Perhaps with a change in focus, we can all be better at keeping our resolutions and serve as the ambassadors for Christ he calls us to be in this New Year.

But "Church" also happens in this building...


THE DEACONESSES did an



BAKED POTATO SOUP

from the kitchen of Debbie Randolph

4 large potatoes

²/₃ cup butter

²/₃ cup flour

6 cups milk

34 tsp salt

½ tsp black pepper

4 green onions, chopped

12 slices bacon, cooked & drained

1¾ cup shredded cheddar cheese

8 oz sour cream

Preheat oven to 400°; bake potatoes one hour and cool.

Cut potatoes in half and scoop out pulp; discard skins.

Melt the butter in a large saucepan over low heat; add flour and stir until smooth.

Gradually add milk, stirring constantly until thick and bubbly.

Add potatoes, salt, pepper, 2 Tbsps of onion, ½ cup bacon, and 1 cup shredded cheese.

Cook until thoroughly heated; add sour cream and additional milk, if needed.

When serving, garnish with onions, bacon, and shredded cheese.


ABW Bible Book of the Month Hosea

Purpose: To warn Israel of the judgment of God and reassure them of the hope of restoration if they repented.

If there is a heartrending story in the Old Testament, it is Hosea. In obedience to God's command, this prophet married - and loved - a prostitute. Later, when she returned to her adulterous ways, Hosea bought her out of slavery for himself.

Hosea was called by God to prophesy against Israel (the ten northern tribes, referred to by Hosea as "Ephraim") in the days of its spiritual prostitution before the people were carried into captivity by Assyria. Part of Hosea's calling included the difficult task of loving an unfaithful wife in order to demonstrate God's love for His people Israel. Hosea's love for his wife, Gomer, showed that God's love for His bride, Israel, was constant and unshakeable despite all the nation's unfaithfulness.
