### Mission Moment - Kihomi Ngwemi & Nzunga Mabudiga - ABC Global Servants in Haiti

Mission Letter – August 2021 Kihomi Ngwemi & Nzunga Mabudiga , Haiti

Dear Loved Ones, We continue our Congo visit. We have moved from the Methodist Guest House to join family members. There is no internet service here.

Our mothers are stable. Nzunga's mother is fine. She needs to eat even though small bites at a time. She has no more meat, just bones on bones and God's free breath. Her spirit is strong. From



time to time, she cracks jokes. She does not see, but remembers everybody who visits. She spends more time in prayers and singing which she is well known for. She sang in choirs/solo all her entire life. She counsels all her visitors.

Kihomi's mom had pneumonia when we arrived and low intake of oxygen. We got her treated. She is fine, but still with a limited movement of her whole body after a stroke almost five years ago. She has missed five years of physical therapy. With a short-term memory loss, she is a delight when she is fully aware. She has been surrounded by a bunch of her nieces, nephews, grand and grand children who keep her on her toes and bring joy no one can buy from any store on earth.

Life is different over here. It was different and has become stranger since we left twenty-four years ago. Churches with loud speakers are everywhere. Some of them side by side. Young with no theological education are becoming evangelists, bishops, pastors. I have three in my extended family.

Roads are invaded by young people doing motorcycle taxis and small cars with a left steering wheel. Traffic jams all day long is another phenomenon current here. Streets are all becoming big open markets. Indians and Pakistanis have become big patrons ruling the commerce. We are fine.

(They will return September 11. Wanting to go to Haiti, but not likely under current situation there.)

Blessings in a Backpack is a program whose mission is to

keep students from going hungry on weekends and remove barriers to academic success. Each Friday during the school year, backpacks filled with non-perishable foods are sent home with qualifying children. Can you help feed them? There is a box in the church hallway. Items needed are cans of soup (chicken noodle, tomato, ABC), Spaghetti Os, cans of fruit & veggies, mac 'n cheese, large slim jims, applesauce, raisins, soft granola bars, fruit and grain bars, canned chicken. 

### HEAVENLY CHICKEN

from the kitchen of Joann Hook

### Ingredients:

- 4 skinless chicken breasts, cut into strips
- 2 Tbsp olive oil
- 11/2 cups light sour cream
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp onion powder
- 1/2 tsp paprika
- 11/2 cups panko bread crumbs
- 2 Tbsp butter, melted
- 375°oven; line cookie sheet with foil & spread olive oil over.
- In a ziplock bag, mix sour cream, salt, onion powder, & paprika; add chicken to bag and turn chicken until all sides are coated.
- Place bread crumbs in a large bowl; dredge each piece of chicken to coat all sides.
- 4) In a small bowl, melt butter.
- Place chicken pieces on prepared pan and drizzle with melted butter.
- Bake 45 min or until chicken reaches 165° internal temperature.
