This letter is in response to your inquiry regarding National Baptist Convention's stance on COVID-19 vaccines.

The National Baptist Convention, USA, Inc. has been an advocate for the three vaccines that have been used – Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson.

It is the opinion of the Leadership that these vaccines:

- 1) Are safe.
- 2) Mitigate the seriousness of COVID (hospitalization and death).
