## **Discussion Questions**

Philippians 1:12-14 – What happened to Paul? (Acts 16:16-40)

What about Paul's imprisonment emboldened the "brothers and sisters" to speak the word without fear? (1:14) What fears do we still have today to speak God's Word?

Philippians 1:15-18 – Who are the ones who proclaim Christ with false motives? (Barnabas (Acts 15)? False teachers?)

I have heard it said, "The best way to destroy a movement is from the inside." I have also heard it said, "The greatest danger to the church is the sin on the inside of the church, not the temptation that lurks outside its doors." What are the internal threats to the movement of the gospel in our families, church, communities, and world?

1:21 - "For to me, living is Christ, and dying is gain." – This is one of the most well-known verses in Philippians. Why is this verse important to our ethic as disciples?

Why does Paul say in verse 24 – "to remain in the flesh is more necessary for you"?

What would our lives need to look like, so that our legacy might be where others have seen our lives and as a result lived lives where others might boast in Christ Jesus?
