

What is a Dinner Group?

Dinner Groups are designed to be an environment where you can casually sit around a table with others that you worship with, but might not know that well yet. It is a chance for you to hear and share your story with others. Dinner Groups are a great way to live IN relationship with one another and help you establish new relationships that could lead to great friendships.

How does a Dinner Group work?

Simply fill out the form available at the Touchpoint Centers, through any of our digital platforms, or by scanning the provided QR code.

will meet for 3 months. The goal is to have dinner together once each month.

Once groups are formed, a Host will be selected from the group roster. They will contact members to arrange the details for the first gathering.

Dinner Group members will share in the joy of having the dinners in their house, and providing the food. Consider picking a dinner "theme night" (i.e. Italian night, favorite recipes, soup night, etc.), and everyone can bring a dish that goes along with that theme.

How are the Dinner Groups formed?

There will be 6-10 adults in a Dinner Group (not including children). These groups will be intentionally designed for you to meet people outside of your normal circle. Groups will not be based on age, Sunday school class, season of life, etc. Simply put, this is a chance for you to become acquainted with many other people in our church.

What does a Host do?

Being a Host is fun and easy (as long as you have a phone and/or email). You can sign up to be a Host on the registration form.

The Host will be responsible for; holding the first dinner group in their home, facilitating dinner conversation, contacting group members to setup the location, dates and food sign-ups for the future gatherings. It is highly recommended to schedule all the future gatherings during the first night together. Hosts will then serve as a point person, as needed

All that sounds pretty good so far, but who cooks the meals?

Everyone! Potluck dinners are the best way to simplify meal planning and distribute the costs among everyone in the group.

This is sounding better and better, but I/we have kids. What happens to them?

The decision to include children will be determined by your group.

Please indicate on the registration form if you are open to including children or must include your children in your Dinner Group. Note: HNaz will not be providing childcare for dinner groups.

What happens after our final Dinner Group?
