2.Pastor's Report – Pastor Cheryl asked the Council to consider extending Brenda Handel-Johnson's Brenda's position at the church through May. She is done the end of April and will be missed. Pastor Cheryl will be taking a vacation Sunday on May 1st for her grandson's confirmation. February activities included worship services, visiting care centers, baptism, funeral services, attending meetings, Pastoral care, confirmation classes, served the Monday Night Banquet, newsletter and article.

Old Business:


Jamboree to feature Brian B and the Company Cowgirls










Grace Lutheran Preschool


