Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

David writes in Psalm 34: "1I will bless the LORD at all times; his praise shall continually be in my mouth. 2My soul makes its boast in the LORD; let the humble hear and be glad. 3O magnify the LORD with me, and let us exalt his name together." Minutes of the Grace Lutheran Council meeting on Thursday, November 11, 2021

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday, November 11, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. with Rick Brownell presiding. Also, present were, Denies Biller, Mark Briley, LeRoy Bullis, Kelly Evjen, James Goble, Paul Henrichs, Sherry Jongeling, Kayla Mohling Geri Mohror, , Gena Urevig, Adam Wientjes, visitor, Heidi Hoekman, Brenda Handel-Johnson, Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett and Cindy Vander Leest. Absent were, Ted Frost, Rhonda Lorenz and Harley Petersen.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by James Goble and second by Denise Biller. Motion carried. A motion to approve the minutes for the October 14, 2021 meeting was made by Geri Mohror and second by Kelly Evjen. Motion carried.

Items:

1.Financial Report— Cindy Vander Leest reported the monthly income to the general fund was \$18,645 the weekly average giving was \$3,729 and the weekly worship attendance was 169 A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Denise Biller and second by James Goble. Motion carried.

2.Pastor's Report – Pastor Cheryl reminded everyone the Soup Supper Fundraiser is following the Thanksgiving worship Sunday, November 21, with worship at 5:00 and soup at 6:00. Everyone is invited to help set up Christmas trees before or after the soup supper. Also all are welcome to help decorate the trees Monday after 5:00 or Friday starting at 1:00. She will be helping the Confirmation students prepare and serve the Monday Night Banquet on November 22nd. After the banquet, she and the Confirmation students will help decorate the trees. It has been a busy month with attending Pastor's meetings, helping with fundraisers, lead 2 funerals, 3 baptisms and served communion at the Care Centers. On November 14th she lead the installation of Intern, Brenda Handel-Johnson. Brenda reported she had her first Internship meeting and has started setting up visitation times with members. She will be here to help with grief support and Bible studies. She is working on the reenactment event of Mary and Joseph (Las Pasadas) which will be held at Grace on December 19th.

Old Business:

Fundraiser Committee - Denise Biller reported the Craft/Vendor Fair fundraiser on November 6th was a huge success. The next fundraiser is the Soup Supper on November 21st followed by the Bake Sale on Sunday, December 12th. The committee is working on holding a Comedy Night, Dance classes, Valentine Dinner and selling Kubota tickets at the Farm Show. Kayla Mohling is working on a Mollie B concert for a fundraiser to be held on Friday, May13th. We are looking for at least 10 sponsors to help pay for the event. Volunteers are wanted and needed to help with all upcoming events.

Constitution and By-Law update - Mark Briley reported the committee would like to leave the number "50" for a quorum on the Constitution and By-Laws. This concludes the committee recommendations to the Council. The Committee would like to get together for their final proof reading before presenting it to the congregation at the Annual meeting to be held on January 23, 2022.

Roof update – LeRoy Bullis reported the Property Committee agreed to sign the contract with Hub City Roofing from Aberdeen, S.D. He also reported weather permitting the job should start in August 2022.

Monday Night Banquet – Rick Brownell introduced Heidi Hoekman from the Monday Night Banquet. Heidi serves on the Banquet Board and schedules the food providers. She explained there are Board members stepping down and they would like Grace Lutheran Church to consider being more involved as Board members, writing Grants and the bookkeeping. It was decided the Council Executive Committee and Geri Mohror would meet with the Monday Night Banquet bookkeeper.

Funeral Policy additions – Cindy reported that she and Pastor have not had time to review and update for the Council. It was decided to table it until February.

New Business:

- 1. Council terms ending and renewals Cindy just reminded the Council terms ending January 2022 for LeRoy Bullis, James Goble, Rhonda Lorenz and Harley Petersen and would all be eligible for another 3 year term. The Nominating Committee would be contacting them for their consideration in rerunning.
- 2. **Draft/Proposed 2022 Mission Plan** Mark Briley shared the committee has been reviewing and some items they would like to increase are the worship and music areas along with following the Synod guidelines for the Pastor's review.
- **3. Annual Committee reports will be due December 27**th The Annual Meeting will be held on Sunday, January 23rd and Committee reports will be due to Cindy by December 27th.
- 4. **Christmas worship services** Pastor Cheryl shared the Children's Christmas program is December 12th at 2:00, Blue Christmas service is Dec. 22nd at 6:00, Christmas Eve services are at 4:00 and 7:00 with communion, Christmas Day is at 10:00 with communion and December 26th there will be ONE service at 10:00. Will Morlock called the meeting to order.

Approve Minutes: A motion to approve the minutes from the October 4, 2021 meeting was made by Gerri Mohr, seconded by Jim Goble, motion passed.

Foundation Sunday will be November 14, 2021. We will serve coffee and cookies between services. Will Morlock will make a presentation concerning the Grace Lutheran Church Foundation at both services on November 14, 2021.

Church update: Will Morlock reported that the trees in the corner of the parking lot will be removed sometime this week or next and the bid was for \$400. Cindy reported on the roof. The original contractor cannot "lock down" a bid because of the cost and availability of materials unless we pay for the materials now. The church also got a bid from Hub City in Aberdeen which was about \$20,000 less than the original contractor.



Mission of the Month ~ Grace Lutheran Christmas Dinner

This month's Mission of the Month is the annual Grace Lutheran Christmas Dinner. Last year (pictured above, there were approximately 500 meals serve through delivers and carry out over the noon hour on Christmas Day. The meals start with planning the food and volunteer sign-up. Volunteers are needed for cooking: to prepare dishes prior to the day and cook on Christmas, about 10 people are needed for cooking that day. There were 8 roasters of turkey and ham (4 of each) 15 gallons of salad; numerous pies made prior to the day, buns, mashed potatoes, dressing, gravy and corn. Volunteer Delivery drivers are needed to take the meals out to the people beginning at 11 am until done. The more drivers there are the less time and trips it takes for the delivery. So it take a LOT of drivers. Volunteers are needed to dish up the food into take-out containers. Each take-out consist of meat, dressing, mashed potatoes and gravy and corn plus a container of salad, a bun, and a container with pie. All are put into a bag and delivered to the people whether it is drive up or delivered. Clean up afterwards. Those who start cooking early in the morning appreciate fresh help to clean up after the hours of getting the meals out. If you are unable to help with these activities, you can always donate to the Christmas dinner as supplies are needed such as to-go containers and food. This is a wonderful Christmas tradition put on by Grace Lutheran each year and a special service to those who are alone at Christmas, have no family, or can no longer cook a traditional meal. It truly shows how grace is experience here daily through the Mission and Ministry of Grace Lutheran. Worship service is at 10 am and serving begins at 11 am. You must be 70 ½ or older when the transfer is made.

The transfer must go directly from your IRA administrator to the church.

The gift counts toward your IRA RMD (required minimum distribution).

IRA rollover gifts are limited to \$100,000 per taxpayer per year.

The distribution is not reported as income, so there is no adverse effect on income tax.

IRA charitable rollovers can be used to fulfill a pledge you may have made to Grace Lutheran Church.

Benefits of an IRA charitable rollover:

Reduce your taxable income, even if you do not itemize your deductions.

You can avoid taxes on transfers of up to \$100,000 from your IRA to Grace Lutheran Church.

You can satisfy your RMD (required minimum distribution).

Gifts can be larger than your RMD and still receive the tax saving benefits.




