Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

"O come, let us sing to the LORD; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation!" (Psalm 95:1)

During Advent and Christmas, a joyful noise could be heard throughout Grace as the choir, bell choir, and soloist added their songs and talents to our service. Special music is a beautiful gift to those of us who worship.

Scripture tells us, music is a way of offering our praise, thanksgiving, and prayers to our God as in Psalm 98:4, "Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises."

Martin Luther wrote many hymns and as you read them, you find the gospel message in each. Luther believed songs were easier to memorize, making them little proclamation each time they were sung and strengthening the faith of those who memorized them. One quote by Luther I particularly enjoy is, "Now let us distress and drive away the devil by singing the Psalm."

After the Israelites crossed the sea and the waters covered Pharaoh and his army, Moses and the people sang to the Lord in praise. (Exodus 15:1)

David sang to the Lord when he had been rescued from his enemies. (2 Samuel 22)

Mary sang her praises in the Magnificat (Luke1:46-56) that we heard in our readings during Advent.

In prison, Paul and Silas began singing about midnight (Acts 16: 25) even while they were suffering.

Music connects God's people to God, and for me, it fills my heart with joy and happiness, as it does for many people. Singing with our church family at Grace is more than just part of the worship service, we are communicating from the depth of our spirit with one another and with our Lord. (Taken from: (cfdiocese.org/bishopsblog/4-purposes)) and as Colossians 3:16 tells us, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God."

Music in worship is more than just singing some well-known songs. It helps us express to God what we feel when we are hopeful, joy filled, repentant, or sorrowful. It often lifts our emotions to a more positive place. Of course, many enjoy the well-known songs, but it's important to hear and learn new ones as well, as they are also beautiful, just unfamiliar and take time to adapt to.

Following the Christmas Eve services, I heard many complements on how beautiful it was, which I passed on to Brenda, our music director. We are blessed by her musical talents and her family for their special gifts. We Thank God for them and the many who shared with us in those lovely services. We even felt the beauty of a song through silence as Marian Raml so beautifully signed "Silent Night."

There are many talented musicians at Grace who are a light shining brightly in our darkness as we continue to adjust to COVID requirements. I encourage others to join the choir or share their musical talents as you see how it blesses and inspires all of us at Grace.

Music has always been a special gift to the people at Grace as it was in King David's time writing,

Minutes of the Grace Lutheran Council meeting on Thursday, December 21, 2021

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday, December 21, 2021 at 5:30 p.m. with Rick Brownell presiding. Also, present were, Mark Briley, LeRoy Bullis, Kelly Evjen, James Goble, Paul Henrichs, Sherry Jongeling, Geri Mohror, Adam Wientjes, , Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett and Cindy Vander Leest. Absent were, Denies Biller, Ted Frost, Rhonda Lorenz, Kayla Mohling, Harley Petersen, Gena Urevig and Brenda Handel-Johnson.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Kelly Evjen and second by Sherry Jongeling. Motion carried. A motion to approve the minutes for the November 11, 2021 meeting was made by James Goble and second by Paul Henrichs. Motion carried.

Items

1.Financial Report— Cindy Vander Leest reported the monthly income to the general fund was \$17,088 the weekly average giving was \$4,272 and the weekly worship attendance was 165. A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Sherry Jongeling and second by Kelly Evjen. Motion carried.

2.Pastor's Report – Pastor Cheryl reported the Las Pasadas was well attended and was lots of fun. She reminded everyone Dec 22nd was the Blue Christmas service @6:00, on Dec 24th services are at 4 & 7, Dec. 25th one service at 10 am followed by the Christmas Dinner that will start serving at 11 and Dec 26 one worship at 10. On January 2, 2022 there will be one service at 10:00. She is planning to take vacation December 26 – 31st and also January 13th -17th to go fishing. On January 10, 2022 Grace Lutheran Church will be serving the Monday Night Banquet. All members are welcome and needed to help.

Old Business:

Fundraiser Committee - The bake sale was a huge success. The committee is working on holding a Comedy Night on January 28th and tickets are available in the office, Dance classes are starting January 11th and they are continuing to sell Kubota tickets and will be selling them at the Farm Show. Kayla Mohling is working on a Mollie B concert for a fundraiser to be held on Friday, May13th. We are looking for at least 10 sponsors to help pay for the event. Volunteers are wanted and needed to help with all upcoming events.

Constitution and By-Law update - Mark Briley reported he emailed a copy to the Synod to review and will follow up with them to see how they are doing.

Council terms ending and renewals Council terms ending January 2022 for LeRoy Bullis, James Goble, Rhonda Lorenz and Harley Petersen and would all be eligible for another 3 year term. James Goble and LeRoy Bullis have agreed to rerun for another 3 year term.

Annual Committee reports will be due December 27th – The Annual Meeting will be held on Sunday, January 23rd and Committee reports will be due to Cindy by December 27th.

Draft/Proposed 2022 Mission Plan – The Council reviewed the 2022 Mission Plan. They would like the 2022 Mission Plan to include a Word and Service position to our staff and budget plan. This position would be a called position and would be on the Synod Guideline salary. The Proposed 2022 Mission Plan has not been voted on by the Council and they will continue to discuss at the January meeting. It is very important for all members to be part of the decision and be at the Annual meeting to hear how it could help Grace. Cindy reviewed the proposed 2022 Mission Plan that would increase our weekly deposit needed to \$8,156 to meet the 2022 budget. The average weekly deposit for 2021 is \$4,579 and to meet our 2021 Mission Plan budget our weekly deposit should be \$6,256.

New Business:

- 1. TV for Fellowship Hall Paul Henrichs has been looking into replacing the Fellowship Hall projector and screen with an 80 inch TV. Most of the funds used for this project would be from Foundation Grants given for our Wholeness Programs and Bible Studies. The projector is not working properly and they feel this would be the best solution.
- 2. Home school Feb-April 2 for 6 weeks every other Friday 9:00 12:00 (59 families) Cindy explained the Home schoolers were calling around checking availability for their get togethers for 117 children. They would be using the kitchen, class rooms and fellowship hall. They would give a small donation and clean all the used areas before they leave. A motion to allow the Home schoolers to use Grace if they needed was made by Paul Henrichs and second by Adam Wienties. Motion carried.
- 3. Annual meeting time and place (Sunday, January 23rd) The Annual meeting will be held at 10:45 immediately following the one worship service (at 10:00) on January 23rd in the sanctuary. Pastor Cheryl shared the children will be singing at the worship service. The Council also would like a potluck dinner to follow the Annual meeting in the fellowship hall.



Anxious - Bible Study on Fighting Anxiety with the Word of God

We live in a broken, sad, scary place. We don't need to watch the natural disasters and political unrest in the news to know what our bodies already know. Our bodies get sick. Our minds are fragile. The mortality rate for

humans is astonishingly high. There's plenty to worry about, and the world is full of faulty solutions for our anxieties.



But true peace comes when we learn to hold God's Word up to what worries us. There, we learn we can't fix ourselves; we can't protect ourselves. Instead, the Bible tells us we can rest, knowing that Jesus walked into the broken, sad, scary places to rescue us and love us. He is the One who fixes. His is the only protection that matters.

A Bible Study Retreat will be held on Saturday, January 22nd in an 8-session study to learn how we can practically take hold of the perfect peace that is only available through God as we dive deeply into His Word, embrace the practice of prayer, and live authentically in the support of our communities of faith. The study, written by Scarlet Hiltibidal, will include her book with video sessions to return to followed the study.

In the study, participants will benefit by

• Learning how to fight your anxiety with the Word of God so you can

take hold of the abun-

dant life Jesus has purchased for you.

- Realizing you're not alone in your struggle with anxiety by prioritizing community and confession over isolation.
- Practicing bringing your anxieties to God and come to know prayer as a pathway to peace.

The cost of this study is \$22.25 which covers the cost of the book. Registration is due by January 12th to ensure getting a book. Lunch will be served at no cost.

Because of the longer book with 8 sessions, participants are asked to cover the first session prior to the retreat.

IRA Charitable Rollover

A Tax-Saving Way to help Grace Lutheran Church

If you are 70 ½ years or older, you may be interested in taking advantage of a simple way to benefit Grace Lutheran Church. The IRA (individual retirement account) Charitable Rollover may lower your income and taxes from your IRA withdrawals.

The Criteria of an IRA Charitable Rollover:

You must be 70 ½ or older when the transfer is made.

The transfer must go directly from your IRA administrator to the church.

The gift counts toward your IRA RMD (required minimum distribution).

IRA rollover gifts are limited to \$100,000 per taxpayer per year.

The distribution is not reported as income, so there is no adverse effect on income tax.

IRA charitable rollovers can be used to fulfill a pledge you may have made to Grace Lutheran Church.

Benefits of an IRA charitable rollover:

Reduce your taxable income, even if you do not itemize your deductions.

You can avoid taxes on transfers of up to \$100,000 from your IRA to Grace Lutheran Church.

You can satisfy your RMD (required minimum distribution).


Gifts can be larger than your RMD and still receive the tax saving benefits.




