
We will have a canopy in case of inclement weather and cancel only if severe weather or other conditions.

## Sprucing up the Courtyard at Grace Lutheran

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Holding worship in the parking lot was not something I had ever thought I'd be doing when I began ministry. But like a lot of things you and I do in life, opportunities allow us to be innovative and create new ideas to address situations that had never been considered before.

So when the prospect to come together in worship developed, even in the parking lot of the church, I felt it would be a wonderful way to see each other, even though it would be through car windows and windshields.

What I didn't realize, was how emotional it would be. At least it was for me.

That surprise came out of nowhere it seems, except through God's great love and grace. You see, I barely got to know some of your faces before worship was suspended and just attaching names to people when worship became video recordings as I stood preaching to an empty sanctuary. Weekly routines and office hours were barely established when services went behind closed doors and conversations were held in zoom meetings.

So when I greeted you that morning, and the horns tooted, I was taken back at how good it was to see you. Even though I couldn't personally see through all the windshields or in the back row of the parking lot, I felt such a sense of connection.

In Hebrews, we are told: "<sup>24</sup> We must consider how to rouse one another to love and good works. <sup>25</sup> We should not stay away from our assembly, as is the custom of some, but encourage one another, and this all the more as you see the day drawing near."

That text means so much more to me now, since we assembled for our parking lot service. It felt SO good and SO encouraging. Reading this passage today I realize even more why it is important to be in community. In doing so, whether it is in the church building, or the parking lot, or any other place, we are encouraged by each other and feel the love of one another when we worship as a community. Whenever the Holy Spirit draws us together, it inspires each of us to be united in the mission and ministry of God work.

Then at the end of the service, as I said "Go in Peace" and you honked your horns, the emotions came back even stronger and I choked up for a few minutes thinking how good it was to be with you.

Over these past weeks, even though I have not seen you, I have come to know and love you through all these crazy ways that we now communicate. It's not the same as sitting down for a conversation over a cup of coffee but we've come together with words of inspiration and reassurance in many simple and positive ways; through notes and emails, through phone calls and text messages, through Facebook and Zoom. It's been inspiring to me and I can't wait to get together with you again.

As Paul writes in Romans: "<sup>11</sup> For I long to see you, that I may share with you some spiritual gift so that you may be strengthened, <sup>12</sup> that is, that you and I may be mutually encouraged by one another's faith, yours and mine."

We don't know how long worship will be suspended keeping us from being together inside the church. But while we wait, we can continue to be the church outside the building as much and as often as we can, while still caring for those who are the most vulnerable through the need for social distancing as we "Bear one another's burdens, and so you will fulfill the law of Christ." (Gal 6:2)

In the meantime, let us continue to be the church, together in Christ in any way that will "rouse one another to love and good works."

## Minutes of the May 14, 2020 Grace Lutheran Council meeting

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday, May 14, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. with James Goble presiding. Also, present were, Denise Biller, Rick Brownell, LeRoy Bullis, Paul Henrichs, Dylan Jordan, Rhonda Lorenz, Geri Mohror, Harley Petersen, Gary Rukstad, Roger Rust, Sherry Starr, Tod Sprouse, Gena Urevig, Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett and Cindy Vander Leest. Absent was Mark Briley.

Pastor Cheryl led the Council in devotions and prayer before the meeting began.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Denise Biller and second by LeRoy Bullis. Motion carried. A motion to approve the minutes for March 30, 2020 meeting was made by Rick Brownell and second by Sherry Starr. Motion carried.

#### Items:

**1.Financial Report**— Cindy Vander Leest reported the April income to the general fund was \$24,590, the expenses were \$20,223 and at this time the balance is \$50,911. We reviewed the analysis of income verses expenses that went out in last month's Gleanings showing the 1<sup>st</sup> quarters shortage of \$16,726. In April we had a net income of \$1,994 because we were proactive with suspending payroll of around 6,800. The boiler has been turned off and we will continue to cut expenses where we can. The drive-in service had a wonderful attendance and an exceptional offering giving and hope we will continue to have more opportunities like that. A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Geri Mohror and second by Rhonda Lorenz. Motion carried.

**2.Pastor's Report** – Pastor Cheryl was very pleased and emotional with the attendance and honking at the drive-in worship service that was held May 10<sup>th</sup>. A motion to purchase a FM transmitter was made by Dylan Jordan and second by Paul Henrichs. Motion carried. Dylan and Paul also volunteered to look at what to purchase for the transmitter. Pastor has been very busy with recording 6 worship services, officiated one funeral, wrote an article for Wtn PO and newsletter, held Zoom classes for Bible study and Confirmation, attended 14 Zoom meetings put 6 bulletins together and continues to record daily readings of Martin Luther on Facebook.

**3.Staff Support Committee report** – Pastor Cheryl updated the Council by reading the committee minutes submitted by Darcy Raethz. They are reviewing all the job descriptions and will be emailing employees for their list of job duties they are currently performing.

#### **Old Business:**

**Summer worship services Sunday & Wednesday-** After discussion it was decided when we do start holding worship services in the sanctuary the one summer worship service at 8:30 worked well last year. It was decided to review again at the next council meeting.

When can activities restart (Quilters, Fellowship Hall gatherings and etc.) A motion to allow a group/committee of 10 or less to start meeting at Grace under the COVID-19 safety guidelines, was made by Dylan Jordan and second by Rick Brownell. Motion carried. Cindy reported the Red Cross blood drive is scheduled to be at Grace on May 27th and would have to follow their safety guidelines.

Calling congregation members cheat sheet – Pastor Cheryl has provided a guideline of update information requests that would be helpful in the office along with other questions and concerns of how members are doing during this time of COVID-19.

### **New Business:**

- 1. Plans and Procedures for reopening Grace The Council reviewed the CDC, State and Bishops guidelines along with a draft of suggested guidelines for Grace Lutheran. The Council discussed and had great suggestions. It is believed that singing is a higher risk and spreads droplets/aerosols further it was suggested to have prerecorded music on the screens or have special music by where the choir sings. Denise Biller was going to contact Health Place in Clear Lake for disposable masks. This topic will be reviewed and discussed again at the next Council meeting.
- **2. Discuss "What is the risk for our community and what is essential for our community"** The council discussed and will continue to discuss at the next Council meeting.
- 3. Discuss Confirmation Sunday, SR recognition and VBS These items will be discussed at the next Council meeting.
- **4. Attendance Tracking and Technical Assistance** Pastor Cheryl reported the synod guidelines/suggestion for tracking attendance during COVID-19 would be using the Facebook and YouTube videos review number times 2. These have been a great way to get God's message out to our members and many others. Thank you to the many volunteers that have made that happen.

A motion to have the next Council meeting on Thursday, May 28<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 was made by LeRoy Bullis and second by Rick Brownell. Motion carried. The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's prayer.
