Grace does not belong to me and as pastors come and go, this is an important exercise for each of you, especially the young, who will plan the next celebrations for 150 years, and 175 years, and 200 years of Grace Lutheran. So I ask you – each and every one – to be part of this visioning process and share in the dream.

Minutes of the Grace Lutheran Council meeting on Thursday, May 12, 2021

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday, May 12, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. with James Goble presiding. Also, present were Denies Biller, Mark Briley, Rick Brownell, LeRoy Bullis, Kelly Evjen, Ted Frost, Paul Henrichs, Sherry Jongeling, Rhonda Lorenz, Kayla Mohling, Geri Mohror, Harley Petersen, Adam Wientjes, Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett and Cindy Vander Leest. Absent was Gena Urevig.

Pastor Cheryl led the Council in devotions and prayer before the meeting began.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Rhonda Lorenz and second by Kelly Evjen. Motion carried. A motion to approve the minutes for the April 8, 2021 meeting was made by Paul Henrichs and second by Geri Mohror. Motion carried.

Items:

1.Financial Report— Cindy Vander Leest reported the monthly income to the general fund was \$25,102 the weekly average giving was \$6,276 and the weekly worship attendance was 326 (includes views on Facebook). A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Rick Brownell and second by LeRoy Bullis. Motion carried.

2.Pastor's Report – Pastor Cheryl continues to lead worship services, baptisms and funerals. She has been busy putting together the Gleanings, bulletins, attending Zoom meetings, and write/create a daily Meditation on Facebook. She had seven attend the May 1st Bible Study Retreat and got good evaluations. She has started doing visitations and communion at the Assisted Living and Care Centers. She has been called to serve on jury duty May 19th. She reminded everyone that she would be on vacation Memorial weekend, May 26 thru June 1st and she has lined up Cathy Zubke to do the worship services on May 30th. She also will be on vacation October 8th thru October 10th for her granddaughters wedding and she will be officiating. Senior recognition Sunday is May 23rd. June 6th is the Blessing of the Motorcycles and VBS starts June 7th to the 11th.

Old Business:

Fundraiser Committee - Denise Biller reported Darlene Bresson is organizing Mother-Daughter dinner and style show for June 23rd at 6:00. Becky Sprouse and the Youth Group are decorating a float for the 4th of July parade. The committee is working on ideas for the 100th celebration on July 18th and would like all the volunteers they can get. James Goble reported the Special Congregation meeting that was to be held on May 9th to vote on a Side by Side purchased at Eastside Equipment for \$12,340 was not conducted because the quorum was not met.

Committee Report on updating Grace Lutheran Church Constitution - James Goble reported the committee met and agreed the Property and Safety committees can be combined and Visitation can be combined with the Fellowship and Outreach Committee.

New Business:

- 1. Monday Night Banquet Rick Brownell asked if the Banquet could hold coffee/social hour prior to handing out the "to go" meals. A motion to allow the Banquet Board and Funeral planners to hold gatherings in the Fellowship Hall based on their decisions and CDC guidelines was made by Denise Biller and second by Adam Wientjes. Motion carried.
- 2. Side by Side Fundraiser Anonymous Grace members have graciously come forward and offered to purchase the Kubota 4WD Side by Side gasoline utility vehicle for the Grace Lutheran Church fundraiser drawing. The first 246 tickets sold will reimburse the Grace members. The Grace members have also stated they are willing to take the risk of any loss if all 246 tickets for reimbursement are not sold. A motion to accept the anonymous Grace members offer to purchase the Kubota Side by Side for the GLC fundraiser drawing and to reimburse the GLC members from the first 246 tickets sold was made by Rick Brownell and second by Paul Henrichs. Motion carried.
- 3. Vision Plan James Goble stated we are putting a lot of money into Grace and we need a Vision Plan to help Grace grow and get members involved. Pastor offered to lead us in a leadership program and Kayla Mohling offered to call and invite our members to be part of the growth at Grace.

No Quorum for a Congregational Vote

There were not enough members in attendance for a congregational vote to be held for the purpose of securing a Kubota 4WD Side-by-Side gasoline utility vehicle RTV-X850 from Eastside Equipment similar to the one pictured. Time was allowed for those attending to provide their thoughts on holding this type of fund-raiser activity.

It was suggested, members should voluntarily give to this type of need in the church. Other felt times have changed and members do not have the resources to support this along with other needs, especially after having so many previous repairs and updates. A suggestion was made to take out a loan to complete the project.

Without a quorum, no vote could be held and the proposal would be turned back to the council for further consideration.

Following the meeting, an anonymous member offered to support the endeavor of the purchase. The council approved the offer and the purchase will go forward.

Tickets for this drawing of chance will be sold for \$50 each. The value of the side-by-side is \$14,700. A set number of tickets will be sold with an expected drawing in December, 2021.

Tickets are currently being sold for a new Remington 3.5 Mag pump shot gun (donated by Cal Brown) in combination with a \$100 beef bundle and \$75 Watertown bucks. The tickets are \$20 each for a chance on one of three items in this drawing to be held on September 30, 2021

Senior Recognition held for nine graduates






