Mollie B, pictured at right, played 13 instruments during her performance, some at the same time and sang several of her own.


Dancers enjoyed old time polka, waltz, two step, jitterbug, line dance

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Accomplishment: something that has been completed or achieved.

We did it. We reached the "Raise the Roof" fund raising goal, even when it moved an additional \$31,000.

Paul writes to the Philippians, "¹²Therefore, my beloved, just as you have always obeyed me, not only in my presence, but much more now in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; ¹³ for it is God who is at work in you, enabling you both to will and to work for his good pleasure." (Phi 2)

"To will and to work for His good pleasure."

What an interesting thought to reflect on as we look back over the last year and a half, God's will for Grace Lutheran. I look on the history of your church with awe and amazement. Such a proud and distinguished history doing God's work and following His will. I guess I would say with the completion of this effort, God's not done with you yet.

In 2 Corinthians 8, Paul writes about giving, "¹⁰And in this matter I am giving my advice: it is appropriate for you who began last year not only to do something but even to desire to do something—¹¹now finish doing it, so that your eagerness may be matched by completing it according to your means. For if the eagerness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has—not according to what one does not have."

After a year, the enthusiasm of the Corinthian people began to fade and Paul was encouraging them to share what they are able with the impoverished Jerusalem Christians because they had shared their spiritual wealth with them.

This is what people have done through the fund raising, and in fundraiser before, for God is at work in you, enabling you both to will and to work for His good pleasure.

Paul goes on to provide rules for giving contrasting heaven with earth reminding the people how Jesus, who was rich in the glory of heaven, gave it all up to be born in a cow shed. He became poor so that humankind might become rich.

That richness is not in money or power, but in the fellowship of the Christian community. In the faith community we have new brothers and sisters, mothers and fathers, possessions, support, counsel, comfort, and the promise of living together in eternity.

This has been the will and the work of Grace Lutheran since their beginning and this is what members have done this past year and a half to raise the funds for the needed new roof, preserving what you already have for years to come.

Like the people of Corinth, there is a tiredness and a tendence to point fingers saying some did not give as much or do as much. The standard of giving for Paul is the love of Christ and what He has given, which none of us can match. But we are reminded if giving more than they were able and making Corinth impoverished would not be helpful. Concentrate on what reward and acknowledgement would be received for giving is defeating. For Paul, the basic thing at stake is the life of the whole church.

If the people of Corinth were not concerned about Christians in Jerusalem and only themselves, they would be in jeopardy of no longer having a church and Christ would be lost to their self-interest.

This speaks into our story. If we do not donate generously to our own community when in need of upkeep and management, we are in danger of losing what makes us rich, the fellowship of our Christian community.

You have all done well Grace Lutheran. You have generously given and shared your resources in whatever way you could, as family does for their own when in need.

But we cannot sit back thinking our work is done as we are told, "²⁴And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, ²⁵not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching." (Heb 10:24-25)

Now is the time to continue in fellowship, continue in the work of building relationship between members and creating a family of faith. For fellowship is the richness of life as 1 John 1 tell you: "3we declare to you what we have seen and heard so that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ."

A fellowship worth more than gold or riches or power or glory in this world. Let us be revived in our efforts to will and to work for His good pleasure and continue to be Grace Lutheran together for years to come.

4-27-22 Meeting Minutes:

Mollie B Concert on Friday May 13th: This will be at Cloud 9 Banquet Hall. They will need help setting up starting at 1:00 pm, doors open at 6:00 pm. Will need help with tickets and wristbands. Cloud 9 will provide someone to card/check for ID for alcohol sales. We are still in need of sponsors. So far we have 6 confirmed sponsors. I have attached the most recent Sponsor Sheet that Pastor Cheryl updated. We have sold 86 tickets at \$30 each. We can sell up to 300 tickets. Expenses for this event are: \$5000 cost to hold event, \$50 for Billboard by Trav's Outfitter's for advertising and the sponsor meals, which are not set yet, but estimated \$30-60 per couple. 
