Congregational Vote 10 am Sunday, May 9th

A congregational vote is schedule for 10 am on Sunday, May 9th for the purpose of securing a Kubota 4WD Side-by-Side gasoline utility vehicle RTV-X850 from Eastside Equipment similar to the one pictured. This will part of the "Raise the Roof" fund raising currently being conducted. This requires a vote of the congregation because the value is more than \$5000 and Grace will be entering into an agreement. Tickets for this drawing of chance will be sold for \$50 each. I feel their uncomfortableness and know they are experiencing something that will stay with them for many years. Each time they think of Good Friday and Easter, they will remember that moment and an understanding of what Jesus did for them will grow. Having unleavened bread was treat as I enjoy making it. Hopefully we will get to a time when we can have that for our regular Communion services.

The children sang so beautifully on Palm Sunday and to have them all there for a Children's Sermon was wonderful to see. Minutes of the Grace Lutheran Council meeting on Thursday, April 8, 2021

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday, April 8, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. with James Goble presiding. Also, present were Denies Biller, Mark Briley, Rick Brownell, LeRoy Bullis, Kelly Evjen, Ted Frost, Paul Henrichs, Sherry Jongeling, Rhonda Lorenz, Kayla Mohling, Geri Mohror, Gena Urevig, Adam Wientjes, Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett and Cindy Vander Leest. Absent was Harley Petersen.

Pastor Cheryl led the Council in devotions and prayer before the meeting began.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Rick Brownell and second by Rhonda Lorenz. Motion carried. A motion to approve the minutes for the March 11, 2021 meeting was made by Rick Brownell and second by Geri Mohror. Motion carried.

Items:

1.Financial Report— Cindy Vander Leest reported the monthly income to the general fund was \$21,066, the weekly average giving was \$4,971 and the weekly worship attendance was 345 (includes drive-in service, views on Facebook and Youtube). A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Denise Biller and second by Kayla Mohling. Motion carried.

2.Pastor's Report – Pastor Cheryl reported the Confirmation students are continuing to meet and Affirmation of Baptism is Sunday, April 25th at the 11:00 service. She continues to lead worship services, baptisms and funerals. She has been busy putting together the Gleanings, bulletins, attending Zoom meetings, and write/create a daily Meditation on Facebook. Bible Study sessions have been completed and there were about 20 who participated. Two students completed their First Communion classes. She will start doing visitations and communion at the Assisted Living and Care Centers. She will be on vacation Memorial weekend, May 26 thru June 1st and she has lined up Cathy Zubke to do the worship services on May 30th. She also will be on vacation October 8th thru October 10th for her granddaughters wedding and she will be officiating.

Old Business:

Committee Report on updating Grace Lutheran Church Constitution - James Goble reported they have a meeting scheduled for April 22nd.

Fundraiser Committee - Denise Biller reported the Jamboree is April 18th and they need volunteers to hang posters around town and to help the day of the event. They will be setting up for the Jamboree on Saturday, April 17th. Rick Brownell and James Goble found a Side by Side at Eastside Equipment for \$12,340. Denise stated the committee would like to sell 500 tickets at \$50.00 each and promote it at the 4th of July parade. They also talked about advertising on the Stein electronic signs. A Remington pump shotgun has been donated to the church and the committee would like to have a \$20.00 ticket for a chance to win one of the 3 items listed, a gun, or a \$100.00 meat bundle or a \$75.00 gift card. A motion to hold a Special Congregational meeting on Mother's Day, Sunday, May 9, 2021 in between worship services, at 10:00 to discuss and vote on having a drawing for the big ticketed item, a Side by Side was made by Geri Mohror and second by Kelly Evjen. Motion carried.

Pastor also reminded everyone that July 18th is our 100 year old building celebration and we will want to promote and raise money at that time.

Sound (curtains) for Fellowship Hall - Rick Brownell reported the material is in and they thought they could deliver them on Tuesday, April 13th. It was decided Rick would rent a lift for Thursday, April 15th at 5:00 and Ted Frost and Paul Henrichs volunteered to help hang them.

New Business:

- 1. Summer worship services (one/two and time/Memorial weekend Sunday is May 30th) It was decided to hold one worship service at 8:30 starting Memorial weekend, Sunday, May 30th until Labor Day weekend, Sunday, September 5th. Pastor Cheryl asked for volunteers or if they knew of any volunteers to help with sound and computers during our worship services and other events. We have wonderful volunteers now but can always use more.
- 2. First Responder's meal Denise Biller reported they would be hosting a meal for the First Responders' on May 21st from 11:00 1:00.

Committee Reports:

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Paul Henrichs and second by Kelly Evjen. Motion carried. The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's prayer.

Mission of the Month ~ "Raise the Roof" Efforts

Grace Lutheran Fellowship Hall and Education wing were dedicated in 1958. The New Narthex was added in 1975. Then in 1992, major repairs were done to the roof, the sanctuary, the bell tower, the parish education unit with the addition of an elevator to access the church sanctuary.

These roofs have served their purpose for more years than are generally estimated and it is now time to do the necessary work of replacing them with a new roof over the Fellowship Hall, Education Wing, Kitchen, Office, Classrooms, and Bell Tower.


The estimated cost of \$140,000 will include: removing the existing ballast and membrane, metal cap (saving it); the installation of h" wood fiber board over roof surface area, and Carlisle 60 mil EPDM; a Ballast Roof System Seal with the installation of walkway pads around 2 large rooftop units, reinstallation of the metal cap and new ballast. To do all the work at one time would actually save money for the cost of equipment that has to be brought in to remove the old roof before building the new.

Grace Lutheran Church has a long history, founded after seven men met to organize a Lutheran Church in Watertown, SD on September 19, 1883. The First Scandinavian Evangelical Lutheran Church of Watertown, Dakota Territory, was organized in a room of the Merchants Bank on Dec. 22, 1883. The first church, a 30 by 40-foot basement less building, was dedicated by Professor Sven Oftedal. The cost of that building was \$2,200.00.

The Cornerstone of the current church building was laid on August 1, 1920 and the name was changed to Grace Lutheran Church on May 9, 1921. The present brick church building (sanctuary) was dedicated on July 10, 1921 by Dr. H. G. Stub. The cost of the church was \$82,068.38.

The Parish Education Annex was dedicated on April 20, 1960. On Sept 28, 1975, the cornerstone as laid for the New Narthex and dedicated on Nov. 30, 1975 along with the rededication of the remodeled Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall.

Grace Lutheran Church is our Mission of the Month and our project for the year to reach the goal of \$140,000 by the summer of 2022 and continue it's long history for years to come.




