Congregational Meeting/VOTE—October 4

A congregational meeting will be held at 9:30 am on October 4th to consider remote council and congregation meetings, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic.

During this time of the COVID-19 pandemic and social distancing, congregational leaders are preparing a recourse to take advantage of technology in the event an annual meeting cannot be held to conduct the business of the congregation.

Some matters may best be postponed until the restrictions on gatherings have been lifted. Others that are pressing, or mandatory by constitution and bylaws may need to be address annually requiring a vote of approval.

For congregational meetings to be held remotely, either electronically or by phone conference, the following provision needs to be added to Grace Lutheran's constitution:

C10.08. This congregation may hold meetings by remote communication, including electronically and by telephone conference, as long as there is an opportunity for simultaneous aural communication. To the extent

permitted by state law, notice of all meetings may be provided electronically.

This provision will allow for all members, even those who have vulnerable immune systems, to participate in the meeting using phone conference, zoom or other electronic devices in the event our congregations cannot gather for their annual meeting. It will also provide the means for members to participate, even in the event a meeting can be held in person, but they are not able to physically attend.

This provision (and only this provision) will be discussed and voted on at a congregational meeting on October 4th at 9:30 am in the parking lot. It will pass by majority vote of the quorum.

This does not in any way stop congregations from holding their annual meeting in-person, but it provides a opportunity to hold a congregational meeting in the event an in-person meeting cannot be held because of closure or quarantine. It also allows the congregation to have both, in-person meetings with the addition of electronic technology (by telephone) for any who would find it unsafe to attend so they can still participate.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

We all have several things in common. The need to have friends. The longing to be loved. A vocation to make us feel good about our accomplishments. And a desire to find joy and happiness in life.

Another is procrastination. I learned how it can cause a lot of problems and even be destructive to procrastinate in life from my dad.

My dad had three jobs when I was growing up. He farmed, was a carpenter and a substituted mail carrier. So at night before he turned in, he would prepare whatever he needed for the job the next day: tools, a trailer of sand, forms for cement, or even the cement mixer to pull to the job. (This was in ancient days when I was young.)

When he got up in the morning to milk cows or do a little farm work before heading to work, he didn't need to find things which could slow him down if not in the right place or needed to be repaired. He'd be on time so the crew wouldn't have to stand around waiting, especially since they were being paid for the hours on the job.

I learned how much easier life is and how time saving it is when you do <u>not</u> procrastinate. But I understand all people do to some degree, including me. I've found myself doing so recently when I did not take my vehicle in on a recall when first notified, so I was unable to make it to a meeting, because I broke down.

Procrastination is defined as "Doing more pleasurable things in place of less pleasurable ones, and thus putting off impending tasks to a later time."

My procrastinating really wasn't about a pleasurable thing ... I thought it would take too much time and just wanted to wait until I had my vehicle serviced. I should not have waited as the time I saved was negatively off set by additional hours having my vehicle towed and getting a driver to take it back home. The experience reminded me how detrimental it is to procrastinate, and I was embarrassed by my lack of responsibility. It was time I could not get back and I was just too late to attend the meeting.

St Augustine of Hippo said: "God has promised forgiveness to your repentance, but He has not promised tomorrow to your procrastination."

In the wake of the increasing number of COVID-19 and the many dangerous life events we are experiencing, it is a good reminded not to procrastinate when it comes to things that are most important in life.

Things like spending time with loved ones who may contract this virus with unpredictable results.

Things like time to read scriptures and attend to the spiritual life necessary to face traumatic situations.

Things like time to hear the Word of God, to strengthen faith, as faith comes from hearing. (Romans 10:17)

If you were to have a tooth ache, put off treatment, the tooth may become decayed, fester and not savable. If you developed a critical health issue and procrastinate, the results could be fatal, too late for timely action.

It is the same with our faith and spiritual life. Putting off reading scripture until someday can leave you vulnerable and lost when suddenly you have contracted a disease and unable to get the time back to awaken your spirit. Waiting until later to attend worship whether in-person, drive-in, or online may be too late if you are suddenly ill with a devastating health issue and need strength and trust in things to come.

If you have been putting it off since the pandemic began, you are invited back: to worship, to Bible study, to hear the Word of God. If you have been waiting for that someday to have more time, you are invited to reprioritize what you value and come back to faith. If you have been waiting for the kids to sit still, you are invited to bring them and fill the church with the beautiful sounds of children in church. For you are told:

You are invited back... for God awaits... with His arms wide open... in the form of Jesus on the cross.

Minutes of the September 10, 2020 Grace Lutheran Council meeting

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday, September 10, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. with James Goble presiding. Also, present were, Denise Biller, Rick Brownell, Mark Briley, Dylan Jordan, Rhonda Lorenz, Geri Mohror, Harley Petersen, Roger Rust, Sherry Starr, Tod Sprouse, Gena Urevig, Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett and Cindy Vander Leest. Absent was LeRoy Bullis, Paul Henrichs and Gary Rukstad.

Pastor Cheryl led the Council in devotions and prayer before the meeting began.

A motion to approve the agenda with the additions of Christmas Supper and Education Superintendent was made by Rick Brownell and second by Sherry Starr. Motion carried. A motion to approve the minutes for the August 13, 2020 meeting was made by Rhonda Lorenz and second by Geri Mohror. Motion carried.

Items:

1.Financial Report— Cindy Vander Leest reported the monthly income to the general fund was \$25,700, the weekly average giving was 5,140 and the weekly worship attendance was 190 (includes drive-in service, views on Facebook and Youtube). A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Denise Biller and second by Rick Brownell. Motion carried.

2.Pastor's Report – Pastor Cheryl reported Confirmation classes have started. She had 2 classes set up one starting at 5:00 and the second starting at 6:00. Due to conflicts there are only 2 students in the first class, so she is looking into only holding one class which would be 18 students spread out in the basement. She is working with 3 students last year's class to confirm this fall. She continues to lead Drive-Up worship services, baptisms, weddings, and funerals. She wrote a Public Opinion article, put together the Gleanings and bulletins, met with Confirmation parents and students and attends Zoom meetings.

Old Business:

Worship services – tentative date for inside worship service at 11:00 on September 20, 2020 – A motion to confirm the inside worship service at 11:00 on September 20, 2020 was made by Dylan Jordan and second by Denise Biller. Motion carried. Reminders were there will be no congregational singing, only the song leader or Praise Team and masks would be recommended for anyone attending services. Pastor Cheryl also stated she is working on having an outside Wednesday night service following Wed. school.

Report on Job Descriptions reviewed with employees – Pastor Cheryl and James Goble reported they have met with all the employees to review and sign their job description except for the Youth and Family Director, Jerod Jordan. A motion to bring office staff back 2 days a week, starting October 1, 2020 was made by Gina Urevig and second by Roger Rust. Motion carried.

New Business:

- 1. Winter Wonderland-Deadline is Monday, October 5, 2020 A motion to be part of Winter Wonderland was made by Dylan Jordan and second by Geri Mohror. Motion carried. The Council "thanked and appreciate" Larry Picht, Darcy Raethz and Gary Rukstad (and possibly Terry Huus) for volunteering to set up, maintain and take down Grace's display.
- 2. Amending the Constitution to include C10.08 Pastor Cheryl explained that the Synod is suggesting for congregations to hold a special meeting to add C10.08 to their Constitutions. This would allow us to hold a meeting electronically or by a conference call if our church was not able to meet to hold congregational meetings in the church. She read C10.08 This congregation may hold meetings by remote communication, including electronically and by telephone conference, as long as there is an opportunity for simultaneous aural communication. To the extent permitted by state law, notice of all meetings may be provided electronically. A motion to call a Special Congregational meeting on October 4, 2020 to vote on adding C10.08 to our constitution was made by Rick Brownell and second by Denise Biller. Motion carried.
- 3. List of Volunteers Pastor Cheryl and James Goble would like to put together a list of volunteers to call upon when extra help is needed. Such as, the volunteer for snow removal, Education Assistant and Youth and Family events.
 - **4. Nominating Committee-** Renewal of Council members Gary Rukstad, Roger Rust & Sherry Starr have fulfilled their 2 terms/6 years and the 3 people ending their first term as of January 2021 are Denise Biller





In-person service have begun in the Sanctuary
