Monday morning they peel and rice the potatoes. On Tuesday the work of rolling, grilling and packaging is done.

Those who gathered for God's Work Our Hand put together 102 school kits, 51 personal care kits and 103 baby care kits working so fast and efficiently, I hardly got a picture. The number of people who

came to load the truck was amazing with many hands unloading trailers, stacking boxes, loading carts and hauling out boxes. You have touched lives around the world of so many with your love, it is a true testament to what Grace is in more ways than one.

I know as I write this there is a group of people in Fellowship Hall making Lefsa for Nordefest Plus. Last week, after just two weeks, they already had nearly 1000 made and packaged. Everyone has a station working together. It reminds me of those days when silage cutters would come through with the big crews and neighbors and families gathered to make a huge meal for all the workers. There would be lunch to haul out to the fields in the morning and afternoon and everyone was busy with the work at hand. I could feel how we are family here, where families and neighbors come together to do God's work and share in these beautiful gifts of Grace.

The brunch was delicious, the first drawing of the bundle complete and Visioning is gaining momentum with the resources from FaithX. God is good and His goodness is seen in so many ways here, truly it is a place where Grace is experience every day. I can't wait to see what October will bring.

Which is filled with several exciting activities for the whole family. Lefsa making workshops continue, then the Flatbrod, donuts and rosettes will be made. These are opportunities for others to join the family and help out preparing for this annual event called Nordefest Plus.

There will be Grandma's Attic once more where many items you are clearing out can be donated with the addition of Grandma Toys for gently used baby clothes and toys. The jewelry room includes purses, scares and you name it for accessory. This is all followed by the Fall Craft Vendor Fair the following week on November 6<sup>th</sup>. We need more singers and especially ask the men to join the choir. Brenda plays the organ so we will have organ music for worship now and then. It will be a joy to have that sound return to our service.

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday, September 9, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. with Rick Brownell presiding. Also, present were, Denies Biller, Mark Briley, LeRoy Bullis, Kelly Evjen, Ted Frost, Paul Henrichs, Rhonda Lorenz, Geri Mohror, Harley Petersen, Gena Urevig, Adam Wientjes, our guest Brenda, Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett and Cindy Vander Leest. Absent were, James Goble, Sherry Jongeling, and Kayla Mohling.

Pastor Cheryl led the Council in devotions and prayer.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Denise Biller and second by Rhonda Lorenz. Motion carried. A motion to approve the minutes for the August 12, 2021 meeting was made by Paul Henrichs and second by Geri Mohror. Motion carried.

#### Items:

**1.Financial Report**— Cindy Vander Leest reported the monthly income to the general fund was \$22,149 the weekly average giving was \$4,430 and the weekly worship attendance was 70. A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Kelly Evjen and second by Denise Biller. Motion carried. A motion to update signers on checking and savings bank accounts held a Dacotah Bank to Cindy Vander Leest, Liz Dunn and Becky Sprouse was made by Denise Biller and second by Geri Mohror. Motion carried.

**2.Pastor's Report** – Pastor Cheryl continues to lead worship services, baptisms and funerals. She has been busy putting together the Gleanings, bulletins, and write/create a daily Meditation on Facebook. She is also visiting homebound members and anyone that would like a visit should call her or the church office to schedule a visit. She has been meeting with the Confirmation students on Wednesday evenings. We have hired Will Rogers for the office communication/assistant position. Our special guest, Brenda will be doing an internship at Grace starting in November and will continue for 6 months. She will be helping in music, grief support and outreach for Grace.

#### **Old Business:**

Fundraiser Committee - Pastor reminded everyone the next meeting will be by zoom at 6:00 on Monday, September 13th. Cindy reported we have sold \$10,000 dollars worth of Kubota sideXside tickets. With fundraisers (not including the Kubota \$10,000), memorial gifts, pledges and donations we have collected \$100,000 of our \$140,000 goal. Denise Biller volunteered the Council to serve the Sunday, September 26th at 9:30 brunch to load the truck for the World Relief kits. The Council agreed to have it be a "free will donation" towards the Roof Fund. (Council will be providing: Geri fruit & juice, Rhonda and Kelly muffins, Ted, Kelly and Denise are bringing egg dish, Rick and Paul cheesy potatoes, Gina juice and Mark rolls. Denise is working with KWAT to have the Kubota sitting at the radio station and sell tickets from 4pm to 7pm on Friday, September 24th. Pastor Cheryl agreed to be on "What's Up" to promote the ticket sales.

**Vision Plan** - Pastor Cheryl will be hosting a "Vision Plan" meeting on Thursday, September 16th at 6:00. Everyone is welcome and bring a friend to the Synod's Visioning with Faith X presentation.

**Constitution and By-Law update** - Mark Briley reported the committee met and the committee would like the Council to agree on a number to lower quorum on C10.04 - Fifty (50) voting members shall constitute a quorum. The Council would like the committee to suggest lowering it from 50 to 40 voting members to constitute a quorum.

**Election of GLC Council Vice-President position** - The 2 candidates left the room and a show of hands elected Mark Briley as the Council Vice-President.

Portico Insurance deadline Oct. 4th - 15th for Ps Cheryl - Cindy reported that the deadline for choosing a Portico insurance plan for Ps Cheryl was Oct. 4th thru the 15th. Grace is fortunate that Ps Cheryl falls into a category that all of Portico's plans cost the same and will not matter which one she chooses. Cindy and Pastor will review the plans and enter it before the deadline. Cindy also reported that Portico has changed insurance providers and the cost will be lower than last year.


#### **New Business:**

#### Mission of the Month ~ Lutheran World Relief

Lutheran World Relief, was founded by Lutherans in the United States at the end of World War II, grounded in Lutheran theology and building on decades of experience. The envision a future where all people, in every corner of the world can live full, dignified lives.

They tackle global poverty by helping people adapt to the challenges that threaten their livelihoods and well-being. LWR works with people based on need, regardless of race, religion or nationality and do not evangelize. They provide aid in emergencies and help



families restore their lives by partnering with communities to build and grow rural economies. Their work is to break the cycle of poverty, so families and communities can thrive with a goal to help people build self-sufficiency and create new



end. Their work includes help in agriculture and emergency assistance. The Quilt & Kit Ministry is the longest running program of LWR. The first quilts distributed in 1945 went to families in war-torn Europe following the Second World War. The date for Foundation Sunday will be chosen at next month's meeting.

Harley and Marilyn Petersen want to start a Designated Fund for pastoral care and the needs of parishioners. They will fund it with a percentage of their will and possibly current monthly contributions.

There were no other items.




