Grace Lutheran Graduating Seniors Recognized




Life is especially difficult during trials and disappointments, At this time of transition, we pray God be with our seniors as they go out to new adventures and experience. May God bless and keep you.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I like to grow things. I like planting flowers to look over the beautiful blossoms on a quiet evening. I like planting garden(s) in springtime and canning. I enjoy all the colors in glass jars: the red salsas and spaghetti sauce; green pickles and relishes, French cut green beans; orange carrots and

peaches, purple grape jelly, and little white potatoes. For me, it's a sense of satisfaction seeing all those jars of yummy food lined up on the shelves. God uses garden themes throughout scriptures to teach us about Him as in Genesis 2: 8-9

⁸ Now the LORD God had planted a garden in the east, in Eden; and there he put the man he had formed. ⁹ The LORD God made all kinds of trees grow out of the ground--trees that were pleasing to the eye and good for food. In the middle of the garden were the tree of life and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

Oh, wouldn't it be nice to be in God's garden? Especially at this time described in Genesis before the fall of humankind when there were no weeds. What a joy that would have been.

Weeds seem to grow whether a good growing season or not. When its dry and the grass stops growing, the weeds continue. You pull weeds and unlike garden plants or flowers, the weeds come back. It would be so nice to pulled them once in the spring to last the entire summer.

Not so... it takes constant work and attention to rid the garden, flowerpots and landscaping of annoying weeds.

We are like that. Our thoughts and reasoning are constantly bombarded by weeds... Satan's influence places that age-old question in our minds: "Did God really mean that?" causing us to doubt His Word and be deceived by desires of our self-centered heart's swaying us from obedience.

What does that look like? What are the weeds Satan convinces us to believe are ok?

- It looks like watching television shows filled with sarcasm, violence, nudity, sexual abuse or corruption.
- It looks like obsession with things like work, internet, social media, sports, hobbies or power.
- It looks like unforgiveness, bitterness, hatefulness, gossip, slander boasting or telling half-truths.
- It looks like greed, striving for popularity over good morals, or oppressive intimidation of those who are different or with differing opinions.
- It looks like being convinced not taking time to attend worship because it is not inside a building so it doesn't matter because it's not really church.
- It looks like scheduling activities on Sunday morning or Wednesday evening without allowing time for faith formation or family worship.

So many weeds that grow in our minds garden planted by the devil convincing us our disobediences is justifiable. Weeds that grow in our hearts often unaware of until they become a noticeable problem. Paul tells us in Galatians 6: 6-7...

"⁷ Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. ⁸ Whoever sows to please their flesh, from the flesh will reap destruction; whoever sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life. ⁹ Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. ¹⁰ Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers."

The only way to keep weeds out is with constant work and attention to God's word. Hearing his words, meditating on His will, discerning His teachings and how they related to us in our lives.

Confirmation starts September 2nd. Rally Sunday and Wednesday on September 13th and 16th respectively. Plans for the high school youth will begin in October. These are the dates for youth to return to faith formation for the year. (COVID permissible.) These are important dates and activities for the young people of our congregation to keep the weeds of evil out of their young minds and hearts. To pull out worldly weeds that threaten to sway them into wrong thinking and disobedience to God's will and plant good seeds of the hope and promise of God's love for them in their hearts.

Theses activities plant the seeds that are so important in the lives of our children, seeds that will grow and strengthen their faith in years to come. Mark 4: 26-29 explains it as:

²⁶ "This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man scatters seed on the ground. ²⁷ Night and day, whether he sleeps or gets up, the seed sprouts and grows, though he does not know how. ²⁸ All by itself the soil produces grain--first the stalk, then the head, then the full kernel in the head. ²⁹ As soon as the grain is ripe, he puts the sickle to it, because the harvest has come."

Plan to bring your children and grandchild... and even your neighboring children... back to church this month... My hope is that you will come also... and weed your garden so God's love and grace will be strengthened in your heart.

The Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting was held on Thursday, August 13, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. with James Goble presiding. Also, present were Denise Biller, Mark Briley Rick Brownell, LeRoy Bullis, Paul Henrichs, Dylan Jordan, Rhonda Lorenz, Geri Mohror, Harley Petersen, Gary Rukstad, Tod Sprouse, Sherry Starr, Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett and Cindy Vander Leest. Absents were Roger Rust and Gina Urevig. Also, present were Nancy McClanahan and a guest from the Staff Support Committee, Kris DeWitt

Pastor Cheryl led the Council in devotions and prayer before the meeting began.

A motion to approve the agenda was made by Rick Brownell and second by Sherry Starr. Motion carried. A motion to approve the minutes for the July 9, 2020 meeting was made by Geri Mohror and second by Gary Rukstad. Motion carried.

INFORMATION ITEMS:

Financial Report: Cindy Vander Leest reported the monthly income to the general fund was \$17,047 the weekly average giving was \$5,484 and the weekly worship attendance was 201 (includes drive-in service, views on Facebook and Youtube). A motion to accept the financial report and pay the bills was made by Denise Biller and second by Rick Brownell. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett July activities included:

4 worship services, had a wedding consultation, lead 2 funeral services, wrote the Gleanings articles, Zoomed 3 Bible Studies, Zoomed 1 Confirmation makeup class, Zoomed Children's Bible Fun Day virtual event, attended Council meeting, attended and lead Pastoral Zoom sessions along with Coaching Training (zoom) 6 times - 2 hr classes, made 4 weekly bulletins and recorded 31 daily readings w/Martin Luther to upload on Facebook. She also reported she will be taking vacation days, August 26th thru the 31st and will be getting Divine Providence for August 30th.

Old Business:

Summer Worship Services - It was decided we would continue the 8:30 drive-in worship services in the parking lot for the month of August. A motion to propose the tentative date of Sunday, September 20, 2020 to hold worship service inside the church was made by Paul Henrichs and second by Dylan Jordan. Motion carried. It was discussed to continue the 8:30 Drive Inn worship service followed by the inside 11:00 worship service following the approved Grace guidelines. A motion to use the individual communion wafer & juice sets at our worship services was made by Geri Mohror and second by LeRoy Bullis. Motion carried. A motion to allow coffee hour once the church building is opened up was made by Dylan Jordan and second by Geri Mohror. Motion carried.

Report from Staff Support on Job Descriptions - Kris DeWitt reported the Staff Support Committee, consisting of Chair person, Darcy Raethz, Becky Reeves and herself, have reviewed and revised the Grace Lutheran Church employee job descriptions and are presenting them to the Council for approval. She reported Jennifer Landon was no longer able to do the Education Assistant position due to personal reasons. She also stated the Staff Support Committee, at a later time, would like to write up duty descriptions/guidelines for our many volunteers. James Goble and the Council members "thanked" the Staff Support Committee for the excellent job, their time and commitment in completing this task. The Council reviewed and discussed the job descriptions. A motion to accept the job descriptions as given by the Staff Support with the added amendment to include "Background checks are required for Grace Lutheran Church employees" on the job descriptions was made by Rick Brownell and second by Rhonda Lorenz. Motion carried.

New Business:

1. Committee Reports - Education, Youth and Family - Dylan reported the committee would like Sun./Wed. school to start as soon and normal as possible. Pastor Cheryl would like Rally Day held outside with lots of games and prizes for the kids and families. She also would like the classes to be held outside as long as the weather will let us. She is planning to start Confirmation classes inside and down the basement where everyone can social distance and have two times with sets of ten in a group. She is also looking into a better than "Zoom" meeting setup called "Canvas" in case we are not able to meet together. Preschool - Pastor Cheryl stated she has met with the Preschool teacher, Ms Kalli and she is putting a COVID-19 waiver in the Preschool Policy. At this time her plan is to continue to stay open even if the Public schools close. It will be the parents decision to have their child attend or not to attend. All Committees - President, James Goble stated he would like a copy of all committee meeting minutes emailed or given to him.

TENTATIVE OPENING OF IN-PERSON WORSHIP AT 11 AM SEPTEMBER 20 Review COVID-19 Response & Guidelines Before Attending

Grace Lutheran Church Council voted to set September 20 as the tentative date for reopening the sanctuary for in-person worship. The worship service will be at 11 a.m. with drive-in worship in the parking lot at 8:30 a.m. for any who do not feel comfortable gathering inside.

Members are asked to review the complete guidelines printed in the July, 2020 Gleanings.

Some of the main guidelines are:

Wash your hands completely, cover coughs and sneezes, stay at home if you are not feeling well or if you are immunocompromised.

You are asked to wear a facemask for your protection and the care and concern of others.

Families may sit together otherwise keep 6 ft between groups. The pews will be marked off for every

other one to be used and to sit staggered from side to side. Bulletins, announcements, and communion packets will be placed in the pews.

There will be no singing, hymnbooks will be removed and the song leaders will stand away from the congregation.

The balcony is off limits. No handshake or touching. If you believe you have come down or are diagnosed with COVID 19 following a service you attended, it is your responsibility to information the church office immediately to notify our members.

The 4 pages of COVID 19 response information will be on the web and Facebook. It can be emailed upon request or a printed copy is available in the office.

Please wear a facemask for your protection and the care and protection of your neighbor.
