

He made the phrase "The Rest of the Story" famous. In his heyday, Paul Harvey was reaching more than 24 million listeners a week. His program was on 1,200 radio stations, 400 Armed Forces Network stations and appeared in 300 newspapers. People loved listening to him, especially when he said, "... and now you know ... the rest of the story."

Mention the name Jonah and most people think how he ran from the Lord. How he boarded a ship bound for a destination, headed in the opposite direction God had told him to go. How he got on that ship and, in the midst of a horrendous storm, pled with his shipmates to throw him overboard because he was the reason for the storm.

**But there's more to the story.** Jonah repented. God gave him a second chance and he was instrumental in helping bring about a citywide revival in Nineveh that included the king!

When most people think of Peter, they think of a big fisherman with a big mouth, saying the wrong thing at the wrong time, even swearing on occasion. People remember him denying the Lord to a young maiden by a fire and a rooster crowing.

**But there's more to the story.** Peter repented. God forgave him and he became one of the most powerful prophets God ever had. He preached one of the most life -changing sermons ever preached on the day of Pentecost and helped start the very first church.

Bring up the name David, people immediately think of Israel's greatest king. They think of a giant named Goliath and some giant mistakes David made. Like committing adultery with Bathsheba, having her husband killed and trying to cover it up, until he was confronted by Nathan – the prophet.

**But there's more to the story.** David repented and God forgave. In fact, God allowed him to write the majority of the Psalms, the Bible's longest book. In the longest chapter of the Psalms, chapter 119, we get a glimpse of one of the most godly men who ever lived. God's own testimony, recorded in 1 Kings 3:14, makes it clear David was a changed man.

How about the name John Mark? Remember him? Those who do, remember him as the young man who turned back from the missionary journey in Pamphylia. He was the source of a dispute between Paul and Barnabas that became so intense they parted ways.

**But there's more to the story.** Although Paul wanted nothing more to do with him when he deserted their mission work in Pamphylia, in his final days, Paul specifically asked for John Mark to come because, "he is helpful to me in my ministry" (2 Timothy 4:11). Obviously, there had been a change in John Mark's life and in Paul's attitude toward him.

What about the Samaritan woman in John 4? When people think of her, they usually think of the well where she was sitting and how Jesus asked her for a drink. They remember the fact Jesus pointed out, she'd been married five times and was currently living with a man who was not her husband.

**But there's more to the story.** She repented, gave her life to the Lord and was responsible for a massive revival in her town.

I remember a friend back in high school, in Kansas, who was a vulgar-mouthed pagan. He used to make fun of people who claimed to be Christians. He was a tough guy, getting into fights and possessing a reputation no one ever envied. He never had even the slightest interest in God or the church.

**But there's more to the story.** I learned after accepting his friend request on Facebook that he is married and one of his goals is to be the most dedicated Christian husband and father and grandfather he can possibly be. He's obviously repented and given his life to God.

I love THE REST OF THE STORY. Don't you? I love the fact God doesn't leave us in our sins, or in our shame, even when some of our friends and even family members do.

The fact is people can and do change. And many times, even though you and I may not know it, **THE REST OF THE STORY** is the best part. There's hope for everyone. Whether your name is Jonah, Peter, David, John Mark, an unnamed Samaritan woman, my friend from high school, or even you! There's hope.

John put it this way, "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9). Our unchanging God will change us into the image of Christ, if we'll just let Him.

You can begin to rewrite **THE REST OF THE STORY** of your own life today, by simply allowing God to do what He does best.

## Philippians 3:20 (ESV)

But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ...

## Reflect

How does being a citizen of heaven change your perspective and your behavior?

Each Memorial Day, we are reminded of the sacrifices that many made to secure and protect the freedoms and privileges that we get to enjoy as citizens of the United States of America. I am proud to be an American citizen. Because I am proud of my citizenship, I follow the laws of the land and perform my civic duties.

Just as I am a proud American, the Philippians were proud Romans. They considered it an honor and a privilege to be a colony of the great Roman empire. Even though they were hundreds of miles from Rome, Philippians were registered Romans. Likewise, as an American citizen, my birth certificate, driver's license, social security card, and passport all identify me as a registered American.

But in today's verse, Paul says that despite records of their official status as Romans, their true citizenship is in heaven. The writer of Hebrews wrote something similar about the Old Testament faithful: "...they were strangers and exiles on the earth. For people who speak thus make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of that land from which they had

gone out, they would have had opportunity to return. But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared for them a city" (Hebrews 11:13b-16).

The Old Testament faithful were strangers and exiles on earth. The Philippians who had trusted in Jesus Christ as their Lord were now also foreigners in this world. And so are we! My documents say that I am an American citizen but really, I am alien here! My primary citizenship is in heaven, not in the USA. No matter what country you call home on this planet, if you belong to Jesus, you don't really belong there. You are a sojourner. Your homeland is in heaven!

Revelation 21 describes our future heavenly home and it promises to be a much better country than any worldly one. No crying, no pain, no death, no evil, unparalleled beauty, a city of light, God in our midst, and Jesus as our King! But in order to gain admittance, Revelation 21:27 says we must have our names written in the Lamb's book of life. The book of life documents that we are registered citizens of heaven.

Friend, is your name written in the Lamb's book of life? Have you confessed Jesus as your Lord and Savior? Jesus reassures us that if we've confessed Him, He will confess our names before God in heaven (Matt.10:32-33) and that our names are written down in heaven forever (Luke 10:20). When we proclaim Christ as Lord, we become documented citizens of God's heavenly kingdom. Given this heavenly citizenship, we should act like proud citizens. We should obey our King and remain loyal to Him, we should participate in the civic duties He has given us, and we should be prepared to sacrifice for our King and our fellow countrymen (other believers).

Most importantly, we should be eagerly awaiting our Savior. The promise of His return should give us hope. The Philippians weren't supposed to place their faith in Caesar, and we shouldn't place our faith in any president. No matter what is happening here on earth, our hope is heaven and our faith is in Christ. We know that this world is our temporary residence. We'll be heading home soon!



SAMUEL: THE MAKING OF A SPIRITUAL LEADER

We often wonder about the childhoods of great people. We have little information about the early years of most of the people mentioned in the Bible. One delightful exception is Samuel; he came as a result of God's answer to Hannah's fervent prayer for a child. (In fact, the name *Samuel* comes from the Hebrew expression, 'heard of God.") God shaped Samuel from the start. Like Moses, Samuel was called to fill many different roles: judge, priest, prophet, counselor, and God's man at a turning point in the history of Israel. God worked through Samuel because Samuel was willing to be one thing: God's servant.

Join us for worship each week this spring for this 7-part biographical study entitled "Samuel: The Making of a Spiritual Leader." Together we will learn so many practical lessons just by looking at how God dealt with one individual who was open to his leading.

## Meal Ministry Reforming

## **Ministry Reports**

- Volunteers for Bible Buddies considered providing a program for two nights at least twice during the summer months.
   It was also suggested that we might possibly look into to presenting a VBS with volunteers from Crossroads Christian Church. Barry and Nancy will explore that possibility with their new pastor Jonathan Caldwell.

## Worship

- David will be on vacation May 27<sup>th</sup> June 3. The board approved presenting the pre-recorded sermon on video to the congregation that day.
- David requested the purchase of some equipment for use in presenting sermons. He requested a curved truss podium, a Shure Wireless Ear Set and coinciding cable. After some discussion Tom Mortenson motioned to approve the purchases and Barry Nelson seconded. The motion carried.

## **Buildings and Grounds**

- Larry Heschke requested that Mike Rose at Valley Glass go ahead purchase the new door for the lower southwest corner. We will have to get a rough arrival date so we can remove the old door ahead of time. The old door and frame will have to be removed using a concrete saw.
- Barry Nelson repaired the downspout on the west side of the building.
  - Joe Draper and Larry Heschke have been working on some maintenance around the building:
    - Larry shaved down door at front of sanctuary so it wouldn't stick anymore
    - \* Larry and Joe nailed all the eaves back in around the building that were loose.
    - \* Larry and Joe also found out that the ash trees on the east side of the building all have the ash borer beetle and will need to be cut down sometime soon.
    - Joe and Larry determined that the roof on the parsonage is likely good for another three years and at that time they will also look into replacing soffits and gutters.
    - \* Larry Heschke is going to work on the west side peak of the building with scraping and repainting this coming week.
    - \* We also need to make sure that gutters get cleaned out on both the church and the parsonage at least a couple times of year.
- David requested a new air conditioning unit for his office. He presented one he thought might work well from Amazon. There was some discussion and Larry Heschke motioned to approve the purchase of the new unit. Tom Mortensen seconded the motion and the motion carried. If the new unit works well in David's office the board may later purchase one for the chapel area.

- The church was gifted a monetary donation from the estate of Louise Dobson. The board will decide where to place the funds after the funds are received.




- It's until death do us part. Then comes eternal rewards or regrets depending on how we spent our lives.
