Cancellation Policy:


We follow the Hudson Public School calendar, including vacation and snow days.

Overview:

Our rooms are set up with a choice of play areas, a snack table and other table-top activities (e.g. Play dough, craft, puzzles etc.)

We start the playgroup at 9:30 a.m., but children and their parent/caregiver may drop in at any time during the morning. It is important that each child is supervised by their own parent/caregiver.



There are two Circle times. The first one is at 10:15 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. for children age 2 and under. The second one is for children ages 3 and up at 10:45 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. For caregivers with multiple children, please choose the ONE circle time you feel is most appropriate. We sing songs and move to music using instruments.

- Clean up begins at 11:15 a.m. (Please help if you can.)
- Session Fee: \$1 per family.



Snacks

A snack and water are available during the morning for the children.

If you choose to bring a snack for your child, please do not bring any peanut products. This will help keep our environment safe for children with allergies.

Coffee and tea are available for parents and caregivers.
