16 All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, 17 so that the servant of God[a] may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

What does scripture being "God-Breathed" make you think of?

God's word is useful for "teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness."

- -What has your experience been in being rebuked? Was it life giving or did you experience more shame? How does God's word work to offer rebuke in our lives?
- -When you read that the Word is useful for "correcting," what comes to mind? Is it positive or negative? What does your response say about how you think about God Himself?

Archive of content:

It's important to have a plan when seeking to build a habit. In the beginning of building this habit, develop a plan, individually or as a Bridge Group, on what engaging with the Bible will look like. A good plan should consist of the following: When & What, plus a good plan b. *Example of a Bible Engagement plan:*

When: 6 am before I get ready for work.

What: One chapter from the BC SOAP guide.

Plan B: I will read my Bible during my lunch break.

When studying the Old Testament, it is important to connect it to the Gospel. Here are a series of questions to ask when seeking to find Christ in the Old Testament:

- What is God doing for HIs people in this story?
- How does God do it even better through Jesus?
- How does believing this change my life?

Use the simple and effective SOAP method of Bible Study:

S-Scripture. Read the assigned chapter for the day

O-Observation. What stuck out to you?

A-Application. How can you apply what you observed to your life?

P-Prayer. Pray that God would help you apply the scripture.
