

Outside Safety General Rules

(rules may be different during COVID protocols)

2020 – 2021 BASC

- Due to frost or morning dew, the hillside in the playground is closed in the mornings
- Trees are not for climbing, hanging, or shaking or bug hunting
- No running on the sidewalk or steps
- Playing is not permitted on the sidewalk closest to the building. It is for those in line for the slide and those on their way to the restroom.
- Slides are for sitting down and sliding only. No running or walking on the slides.
- Tag may be played on the field
- Basketball, 4 square and wall balls are for use in the CAPS building
- Soccer balls and footballs are for use on the field
- Students may sit on the stones between the CAPS building and playground, but not the ones along the fence. These stones are not for standing or walking on.
- Students may not move the stones or play on them
- The dirt area between the CAPS building is not a part of the play area. Students are asked to not play in this area.
- Those swinging should sit on the swing on their bottoms. They may not twist, stand, or double up on their swing
- There is no climbing or hanging from the swing structure
- There is no jumping off while swings are in motion
- For safety reasons, student should avoid walking between the CAPS building and the swings
- Students may not sit on or stand on the freestanding tube
- Students may not sit or stand on the monkey bars
- Red monkey bars are best for grades K and up
- Blue swinging bars, like monkey bars, are best for taller children. Students in grades K and younger usually are not tall enough and may be asked to use the other monkey bars.
- Students are asked to stay close to the play area. This means that students should avoid going more than halfway down the field and not in the tree line or near the fences
