FOCUS ON THE GOSPEL

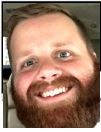

For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Peter, and then to the Twelve."**

Our mission at Jefferson Avenue is to get this message to every person in the Upper Cumberland and around the world. The gospel is about making disciples. People need the hope of the gospel. Remember: the gospel has the power to change a person's life! The gospel is not just about information, but transformation. The main thing is to keep the main thing the main thing - and the main thing is the gospel.

Collins' Corner

EXODUS 17:8-13

Then Amalek came and fought with Israel at Rephidim. So Moses said to Joshua, "Choose for us men, and go out and fight with Amalek. Tomorrow I will stand on the top of the hill with the staff of God in my hand." So Joshua did as Moses told him, and fought with Amalek, while Moses, Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. Whenever Moses held up his hand, Israel prevailed, and whenever he lowered his hand, Amalek prevailed. But Moses' hands grew weary, so they took a stone and put it under him, and he sat on it, while Aaron and Hur held up his hands, one on one side, and the other on the other side. So his hands were steady until the going down of the sun. And Joshua overwhelmed Amalek and his people with the sword.

There is no doubt, when this battle is over, who the real hero of the battle was. It was God. Moses couldn't take on this challenge on his own. He didn't have the strength to fight this fight alone. Neither did Joshua. They needed each other, and they needed Aaron and Hur. And, with the help of each other, they were all able to take on this challenge in a way that resulted in the people that saw it honoring God.

Now, think for a second about the obstacles that we will face in life. Those that seem insurmountable. Those that seem impossible. How is it that we respond to an obstacle or a challenge that we face in our life? How do I function when I've been hit with grief? How do I deal with disappointment? How is it that I have that tough conversation? How do I get the strength to make that decision that I've been putting off?

All of us will face moments in our lives that are big, obvious obstacles. Some of them will seem like a detriment to our faith — and it will be if we allow it to be. The best possible outcome for the tough moments in our lives is for us to overcome them in a way that honors God and gives him the glory. How do we do this? We rely on each other, on fellow believers. The Lord did not design this life for us to go about it alone, and we need to humble ourselves to the point where we understand that we need to be supported by other people — and in turn, support other people. **Matt**



Earful from Evan

Unity in the early church is a challenge Paul continually addressed in his letters. Various backgrounds, opinions, and beliefs lead to a lot of disagreements in the Corinthian church. Paul addresses them in 1 Corinthians: *I appeal to you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree and that there be no dissensions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgment.* (1 Corinthians 1:10). Their issue was focused on in vs 12: *What I mean is that each one of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Peter, or "I belong to Christ."* (1 Corinthians 1:12)

These were not splits yet but there were four factions within the congregation. Many of the other problems facing the church in Corinth were flowing out of this division. Due to space let's just focus on Paul's solution instead of their specific unity problem. In verse 10 He gives them all the ground of unity they need. The ground, of course, is the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. "I appeal to you," he says, "by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." Their relationship to Christ was the unifying factor of the church. One commentator put it this way: **There is no other name big enough, great enough, glorious enough, and powerful enough to gather everybody together, despite the diversity of viewpoint and the differences of background or status in life, than the name of Jesus.**

Jews and Gentiles didn't have a lot in common but what they shared was the most important: Christ. That is why the apostle appeals to it. We are a family made up of brothers and sisters because we have His life in us. Paul calls them back to this fundamental issue. When we get married a lot of times people come into it with two different blueprints of what marriage should look like. How blessed is a relationship between two very different people when their common ground is Christ. What better of a foundation can a relationship have than Christ.

And if you are thinking: Evan, faith isn't really the bedrock of my relationship. I want my marriage to be good without God. I've seen plenty of other couples even ones that I am related have a successful marriage. I don't think Jesus is needed. Then I'd say marriage can be successful in a lot of ways without Jesus. But I don't see how it can be successful in accomplishing God's plan for man without Him at the core. How can our relationships be based more on Christ will be our next focus. **Evan**
