

OUR STORY

FOP CHURCH STATEMENT OF FAITH

1. We believe the Holy Bible, consisting of both Old and New Testaments, is the inspired revelation of God to man. Therefore, the Scriptures are the infallible, authoritative rule for all matters of faith and conduct.
2. We believe in one God eternally existing in three persons; namely, the Father, Son and Holy Ghost.
3. We believe that Jesus Christ is the only begotten Son of the Father, conceived of the Holy Ghost and born of the Virgin Mary; that Jesus was crucified, buried, and raised from the dead; that He ascended to heaven and is today at the right hand of the Father as the Intercessor.
4. We believe that all have sinned and come short of the glory of God and that repentance is commanded of God for all and necessary for forgiveness of sins.
5. We believe that justification, regeneration and the new birth are wrought by faith in the blood of Jesus Christ.
6. We believe in sanctification subsequent to the new birth, through faith in the blood of Christ, through the Word and by the Holy Ghost.
7. We believe in Holiness to be God's standard of living for His people.
8. We believe the Holy Spirit baptism, as experienced in the early Christian Church, is promised to all believers in Christ, imparting to them spiritual gifts (charisma), to edify the body of Christ and equip for Christian service. This experience is distinct from and subsequent to the new birth and enables the believer to receive a spiritual language (glossolalia) for personal edification and prayer.
9. We believe the Church of Jesus Christ is the habitation of God through the Spirit, with divine appointments for the fulfillment of the great commission. Each believer, having been born of the Spirit, is a valuable part of the body of Christ. We further believe in a called and ordained five-fold ministry for the purpose of the evangelization of the world and the edifying of the Body of Christ.
10. We believe in water baptism by immersion, and all who repent should be baptized in the name of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.
11. We believe divine healing is provided for all in the Atonement.
12. We believe in the Lord's Supper and washing of the saints' feet.
13. We believe in the second coming of Christ to receive the church unto himself and rule and reign forever. The return of Jesus Christ is imminent and will precede his reign upon the earth and the final judgments. Afterward there will be a new heaven and new earth.

GIFT DEFINITIONS AND SCRIPTURE REFERENCES

Finding your top 3-4 highest totals, locate the associated letter with the descriptions below to discover your God-given spiritual gifts. The following contains definitions of spiritual gifts. While not meant to be dogmatic or final, these definitions and supporting scriptures do correspond to characteristics of the gifts as expressed in the Spiritual Gifts Questionnaire.

A. ADMINISTRATION

The gift of administration is the divine strength or ability to organize multiple tasks and groups of people to accomplish these tasks. Luke 14:28-30; Acts 6:1-7; 1 Corinthians 12:28

B. APOSTLESHIP

The gift of apostleship is the divine strength or ability to pioneer new churches and ministries through planting, overseeing, and training. Acts 15:22-35; 1 Corinthians 12:28; 2 Corinthians 12:12; Galatians 2:7-10; Ephesians 4:11-14

C. CRAFTSMANSHIP

The gift of craftsmanship is the divine strength or ability to plan, build, and work with your hands in construction environments to accomplish multiple ministry applications. Exodus 30:22, Exodus 31:3-11; 2 Chronicles 34:9-13; Acts 18:2-3

D. DISCERNMENT

The gift of discernment is the divine strength or ability to spiritually identify falsehood and to distinguish between right and wrong motives and situations. Matthew 16:21-23; Acts 5:1-11, 16:16-18; 1 Corinthians 12:10; 1 John 4:1-6

E. EVANGELISM

The gift of evangelism is the divine strength or ability to help non-Christians take the necessary steps to becoming a born-again Christian. Acts 8:5-6, 8:26-40, 14:21, 21:8; Ephesians 4:11-14

F. EXHORTATION

The gift of exhortation is the divine strength or ability to encourage others through the written or spoken word and Biblical truth. Acts 14:22; Romans 12:8; 1 Timothy 4:13; Hebrews 10:24-25

G. FAITH

The gift of faith is the divine strength or ability to believe in God for unseen supernatural results in every arena of life. Acts 11:22-24; Romans 4:18-21; 1 Corinthians 12:9; Hebrews 11

H. GIVING

The gift of giving is the divine strength or ability to produce wealth and to give by tithes and offerings for the purpose of advancing the Kingdom of God on earth. Mark 12:41-44; Romans 12:8; 2 Corinthians 8:1-7, 9:2-7

I. HEALING

The gift of healing is the divine strength or ability to act as an intermediary in faith, prayer, and by the laying-on of hands for the healing of physical and mental illnesses. Acts 3:1-10, Acts 9:32-35, Acts 28:7-10; 1 Corinthians 12:9, 28

J. HELPS

The gift of helps is the divine strength or ability to work in a supportive role for the accomplishment of tasks in Christian ministry. Mark 15:40-41; Acts 9:36; Romans 16:1-2; 1 Corinthians 12:28

K. HOSPITALITY

The gift of hospitality is the divine strength or ability to create warm, welcoming environments for others in places such as your home, office, or church. Acts 16:14-15; Romans 12:13, 16:23; Hebrews 13:1-2; 1 Peter 4:9

L. INTERCESSION

The gift of intercession is the divine strength or ability to stand in the gap in prayer for someone, something, or someplace, believing for profound results. Hebrews 7:25; Colossians 1:9-12, 4:12-13; James 5:14-16

M. KNOWLEDGE

The gift of knowledge is the divine strength or ability to understand and to bring clarity to situations and circumstances often accompanied by a word from God. Acts 5:1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:8; Colossians 2:2-3

N. LEADERSHIP

The gift of leadership is the divine strength or ability to influence people at their level while directing and focusing them on the big picture, vision, or idea. Romans 12:8; 1 Timothy 3:1-13, 5:17; Hebrews 13:17

O. MERCY

The gift of mercy is the divine strength or ability to feel empathy and to care for those who are hurting in any way. Matthew 9:35-36; Mark 9:41; Romans 12:8; 1 Thessalonians 5:14

P. MIRACLES

The gift of miracles is the divine strength or ability to alter the natural outcomes of life in a supernatural way through prayer, faith, and divine direction. Acts 9:36-42, 19:11-12, 20:7-12; Romans 15:18-19; 1 Corinthians 12:10, 28

Q. MISSIONARY

The gift of missions is the divine strength or ability to reach others outside of your culture and nationality, while in most cases living in that culture or nation. Acts 8:4, 13:2-3, 22:21; Romans 10:15

R. MUSIC / WORSHIP

The gift of music/worship is the divine strength or ability to sing, dance, or play an instrument primarily for the purpose of helping others worship God. Deuteronomy 31:22; 1 Samuel 16:16; 1 Chronicles 16:41-42; 2 Chronicles 5:12-13, 34:12; Psalm 150

S. PASTOR / SHEPHERD

The gift of pastor/shepherd is the divine strength or ability to care for the personal needs of others by nurturing and mending life issues. John 10:1-18; Ephesians 4:11-14; 1 Timothy 3:1-7; 1 Peter 5:1-3

T. PROPHECY

The gift of prophecy is the divine strength or ability to boldly speak and bring clarity to scriptural and doctrinal truth, in some cases foretelling God's plan. Acts 2:37-40, 7:51-53, 26:24-29; 1 Corinthians 14:1-4; 1 Thessalonians 1:5

U. SERVICE

The gift of serving is the divine strength or ability to do small or great tasks in working for the overall good of the body of Christ. Acts 6:1-7; Romans 12:7; Galatians 6:10; 1 Timothy 1:16-18; Titus 3:14

V. TEACHING

The gift of teaching is the divine strength or ability to study and learn from the Scriptures primarily to bring understanding and depth to other Christians. Acts 18:24-28, 20:20-21; 1 Corinthians 12:28; Ephesians 4:11-14

W. TONGUES (and Interpretation)

The gift of tongues is the divine strength or ability to pray in a heavenly language to encourage your spirit and to commune with God. The gift of tongues is often accompanied by interpretation and should be used appropriately. Acts 2:1-13; 1 Corinthians 12:10, 14:1-14

X. WISDOM

The gift of wisdom is the divine strength or ability to apply the truths of Scripture in a practical way, producing the fruitful outcome and character of Jesus Christ. Acts 6:3,10; 1 Corinthians 2:6-13, 12:8

MINISTRY DESCRIPTIONS

ALTAR TEAM: These individuals cover the weekend and midweek services in prayer, preparing the way for the Lord. Join this team that is blazing the trail for God in our community!

BAPTISM TEAM: These are the people that help make our Baptism Sundays flow flawlessly! They arrive early on Baptism Sunday to prepare the t-shirts for those signed up to be baptized, they take names and prepare name tags for those being baptized, and they direct people where to change clothes before and after baptism so that the entire event flows easily.

BENEVOLENCE: This circle loves on people at a critical time of need, whether in sickness or a time of loss, by providing a meal that relieves a pressure point for the family, allowing them to focus on their particular situation. (Contacted for serving upon need)

BREAKING CHAINS MINISTRY: This group provides prayer rooms set up with inner healing and deliverance in mind. Sessions are on the second Monday of each month at 6:30pm, by appointment only. All sessions are confidential.

COFFEE STATION TEAM: Who doesn't love coffee?! This group of people prepares coffee for our coffee station each weekend during services, restocks supplies when necessary and helps ensure that the coffee station area is clean and presentable for all our church family.

FOP GROUPS: We believe that real life change takes place in the context of relationships. As a small group leader, you have the greatest opportunity to connect with others, fulfill your passions, develop your gifts and live out the Great Commission. FOP Group Leader training available on specific dates, noted on our website.

FOP JUNIOR KIDZ: This group leads children, ages birth to kindergarten, into a real relationship with Jesus through Bible stories, worship, prayer, hands-on activities and personal interactions. You can sign up as a teacher, helper or crafts, as needed. (Background check required)

FOP KIDZ MINISTRY: Our team creates an environment where our children are consistently exposed to the real love of Jesus. This gang leads 1st thru 6th graders into a real relationship with Jesus. Through worship, videos, skits, small groups, greeting, games and more, this team intentionally invests in the lives of our children. (Background check required)

FOP YOUNG ADULTS: This group meets every 1st and 3rd Monday at the church at 7pm to fellowship and minister to our young adults aged 18-30.

FOP YTH MINISTRIES: FOP Youth Ministries is a relational, discipleship-based ministry for junior and senior high teens. Our mission is to see students develop an intimate relationship with Jesus Christ. (Background check required)

GREETER TEAM: This friendly crew loves people and makes them feel at home here at Fellowship of Praise. They welcome guests with a smile, encouragement and personal touch so that hearts are open to the Gospel message.

LADIES MINISTRY: These members serve by connecting with guests through a warm conversation and an authentic welcome during monthly events.

MEDIA TEAM: This crew uses their skills with sound technology, lighting, cameras and video to take the message of Christ outside our building to our online campus each Sunday morning via live stream. We have a full production crew including camera operators, director, lyrics, live stream operators, video switcher, and other positions as well.

NURSING HOME MINISTRY: This team visit residents weekly at Pine Ridge Skilled Nursing in Morrow on and Quaker Heights in Waynesville.

PROMO TEAM: This team puts together designs and ideas for our FOP Church merchandise.

REACH TEAM: This team plans and executes several outreach-oriented events each year. If you love to REACH the hurting, this is the team for you.

SALT SENIORS MINISTRY: Our senior ministry's goal is to encourage those who are 50 and over to participate in activities that foster spiritual growth and health, age-level educational pursuits, evangelistic outreaches, and wholesome fellowship events.

SECURITY TEAM: This team of select men and women are positioned at strategic places within our building to identify and neutralize any possible threats to safety while we are in service. (Background Check required)

USHERS: These men and women prepare people for a positive worship experience by welcoming and assisting them to a seat and maintaining a distraction-free environment. (Background check required)

WELCOME CENTER TEAM: This team connects guests to the church community, providing information on all of our current events, ministry opportunities and services at FOP Church.

WIDOWS MINISTRY: Their mission is to provide support and comfort by connecting the widows to each other and to the resources of Fellowship of Praise.

WORSHIP TEAM: Using vocals and/or instruments, this team serves to prepare the way for our church family to encounter the presence of the Living God. (Audition and weekly rehearsals required)

YOUR FATHER'S KITCHEN: This team partners with Sugartree Ministries in Wilmington on the second Tuesday of every month at 5:30pm to feed those in need in the Wilmington area at the Your Father's Kitchen soup kitchen.




Below are ten steps that will get you started using the Planning Center Services platform. If you have any other specific questions, feel free to ask your ministry team leader!

In FOP Connect part two, your email address might be added to our church's Planning Center account. You'll receive a Welcome Email that will instruct you to create a username and password. When this is completed, you can continue with the below steps.

Go to the App Store (iTunes or Google Play) and download the "Planning Center Services" app.

When the app is downloaded, sign in with your username and password.



You'll see requests for you to serve in "yellow" with the date and information for your volunteer position. You can click "Accept" or "Decline" based on your availability. Click the "clock" symbol in the top right corner to see what specific service times you're requested to serve.

If you "Decline", you will need to write in a reason why you're not available (vacation, work, sick, etc.). This helps our staff to better know what works best for your schedule and your participation in the ministry.


When you "Accept" or "Decline" to serve in a certain position, you will be able to see your assigned/ accepted dates in "green" along with details of that service time as well as any special instructions you might need specific to that day.

If you know of dates that you will NOT be able to serve due to work or vacation or another reason, feel free to add those dates to your "Blockout" calendar by clicking the "three lines icon" in the top right corner of your Home Screen in the app.

A menu will appear to the left of the screen, and at the bottom you'll see "Blockout". Click "Blockout" and fill in the necessary information about why you aren't able to serve on the dates you select. You can add in recurring dates as well.

Once you've put in your blockout date info, click the "checkmark" in the top right corner to save it. Now your ministry team leader will know not to schedule you on the dates you have on your "Blockout" calendar.
