Phase Two Regathering Plan Frequently Asked Questions

What will the service look like?

- There will be no nursery or childcare available during services. If your child gets restless, you may take your child to the cafe to watch the service.
- Our services will be family-worship style, and family units are encouraged to sit six feet from other family units.
- We ask as you choose a seat, please do not change seats once you are seated.
- No offering envelopes or plates will be passed. Greeters will provide an offering envelope to you. You may place your envelope in the collection containers in the lobby. You may also give electronically via Realm or by texting 'SHBC' to 73256.
- Changing stations and nursing moms areas will be available at all campuses.

What are the cleaning procedures between services?

All hard surfaces will be cleaned and sanitized and soft surfaces will be sprayed with sanitizer, following CDC guidelines.

Do I have to wear a mask?

Masks are encouraged, but not required.

Will there be temperature checks at the door?

While we are not checking temperatures at our services, it would be a good practice to take everyone's temperature at your house before attending a service. If you or anyone in your house is running a fever of 100.4 or above, please do not attend a service in person. Services are streamed online.

Will I receive a bulletin for the service?

Bulletins will be available via hard-copy and online formats.

Will there be greeters at the door as normal?

- Greeters will be stationed at the doors to open the exterior doors and pass out bulletins/offering envelopes to minimize your need for touching surfaces.
- We will also have ushers inside the sanctuary to assist with seating and to make sure there is a safe distance between family units.

Will there be a one way in and one way out?

We will have all entrances/exits open and available for use. Please remember to observe strict social distancing as you enter and exit.

Will we participate in the Lord's Supper in-person?

Yes! We will celebrate the Lord's Supper on our regular schedule, the last Sunday of each month. We have individually packaged, prefilled communion cups.

Can I still get coffee in the cafe?

No, the cafes are closed, and we will not have any food or drinks available.

Recommended practices:

- Wash or sanitize your hands often (hand sanitizer will be available at all campuses)
- Cough or sneeze into your elbow then wash or sanitize your hands.
- For coughs that develop for any reason during the service, please finish watching the sermon in the cafe to put others around you at ease.
- If you or anyone in your immediate family is currently running a fever, have flu-like symptoms or not feeling well, please stay home to prevent the spread to others.
- Please use a friendly wave instead of handshakes and hugs.
