Computing – The ability to add, estimate, total, calculate
Connecting – The ability to link together, involve, relate
Cooking – The ability to prepare, serve, feed, cater
Coordinating – The ability to organize, match, harmonize
Counseling – The ability to guide, advise, support, listen, care for
Decorating – The ability to beautify, enhance, adorn
Editing – The ability to correct, amend, alter, improve
Encouraging – The ability to cheer, inspire, support
Engineering – The ability to construct, design, plan
Facilitating – The ability to help, aid, assist, make possible
Improving – The ability to better, enhance, further, enrich
Influencing – The ability to affect, sway, shape, change
Landscaping – The ability to garden, plant, improve
Leading – The ability to pave the way, direct, excel, win
Learning – The ability to study, gather, understand, improve, expand self
Managing – The ability to run, handle, oversee
Mentoring – The ability to advise, guide, teach
Operating – The ability to run mechanical or technical things

Organizing – The ability to simplify, arrange, fix, classify, coordinate
Performing – The ability to sing, speak, dance, play an instrument, act out.
Persevering – The ability to see things to completion, persisting at something until finished.
Pioneering – The ability to bring about something new, groundbreaking, original
Promoting – The ability to sell, sponsor, endorse, showcase
Repairing – The ability to fix, mend, restore, heal
Researching – The ability to seek, gather, examine, study
Shopping – The ability to collect, or obtain things, getting the best quality for the best price
Social Networking – The ability to communicate using the latest technology
Strategizing – The ability to think ahead, calculate, scheme
Teaching – The ability to interpret, decode, explain, speak
Visualizing – The ability to picture, imagine, envision, dream, conceptualize
Welcoming – The ability to entertain, greet, embrace, make comfortable
Writing – The ability to compose, create, record

PERSONALITY

Personality is one of the critical factors in finding your serving "Sweet Spot". It indicates how you prefer to relate to other people and the world around you. This section focuses on the main two aspects of how you are energized and organized.

<u>Directions</u>: For each statement, there are two opposite responses. Circle the number that most accurately describes what you prefer in most situations. Select the behavior or perspective that comes naturally to YOU (not what others expect of you or what you have learned.) Answer as if there were no restrictions on or consequences for your personal expression.

(Example: For Question #1, selecting 1 mean you absolutely prefer doing things over being with people, selecting 5 means you absolutely prefer being with people, and selecting 3 means you like both equally.)
