Scholarship Endowment History

The idea for creating endowed scholarships for Second Baptist Church was conceived by the late Pastor, Rev. Dr. Booker T. Hopkins, Sr. The concept was presented to the joint boards and congregation and overwhelmingly supported and approved in December, 1986. In supporting the scholarship and endowment purposes, the first scholarship banquet was held in 1991 at the Raddison On-The-Lake Hotel and the first recipient was Andria Taylor.

Pastor Hopkins' initial plan was to create three endowments of \$25,000 each at Eastern Michigan University, Washtenaw Community College and Tennessee State University. A pledge program at the church represented the kick-off. The EMU endowment was successfully completed and named The B.T. Hopkins Endowed Scholarship. With the WCC endowment nearly completed, God chose to call Rev. Hopkins to a new kingdom.

This endowment was subsequently completed and endowed at a \$20,000 level. It was endowed in the name of B. T. and G. L. Hopkins/Second Baptist Church, Ypsilanti Scholarship. Because of Pastor Hopkins' passing, the dream of an endowment at Tennessee State University was never realized.

Under new pastoral leadership, the Second Baptist Scholarship Committee was reactivated in December, 2002. The group has faithfully labored under the chairmanship of Dr. James Hawkins, Vice Chair of the Trustee Ministry. With the support of the congregation and community, the committee has annually expanded the endowment principal in an effort to maximize scholarship revenue. Commencing with the 2016-2017 school year, the Scholarship Ministry recommended and the membership supported, expanding the provision of financial support to eligible members attending non-endowment colleges/universities.

Currently, our Pastor George W. Waddles, Jr., is an ardent supporter of Dr. Hopkins' vision. So much so, that he recommended the implementation of a "Scholarship Sunday" because of the COVID pandemic and not being able to have our main in-person fundraiser banquet.

Rev. Kevin Sanders graduated from Eastern Michigan University in Ypsilanti, Michigan with his B.A.S. in Communication & Public Speaking with a focus in Media Arts. With this foundation, he is now the host/producer of INSPIRE INTERNATIONAL MEDIA which is a positive media outreach touching thousands of lives daily. He is active in the Metro Detroit community assisting with youth programs, non-profit organizations, and multiple efforts bringing life to those who struggle with the challenges of life. As a Motivational Speaker, he believes in touching the lives of thousands one testimony at a time.

Rev. Sanders is thankful for every opportunity to shift the environment by encouraging, teaching, motivating, ministering, and most of all sharing the power of the Word of God through his overcoming trials and successes in life.

Currently, Rev. Sanders is using his media ministry testimony to encourage youth, mentor teens, support families, and assist leaders in their vision during these challenging times. 
Ypsilanti-area residents are invited to help paint a Black Lives Matter mural on South Washington Street in downtown Ypsilanti between Michigan Avenue and Ferris Street, and to attend a Juneteenth celebration featuring the unveiling of the mural. City council approved the mural project during its Feb. 16 regular meeting. Community members of high school age or older are invited to participate in painting the mural June 5. If the work isn't wrapped up that day, the project will finish up the following day. The mural will be officially unveiled during a Juneteenth celebration from noon-3 p.m. June 19. The event will feature local DJs and musical artists including Johnny Lawrence and Athena Johnson and Friends.
