REVIEW

- 2. Describe in your own words, in a couple of sentences, what the helmet of salvation is.
- 3. Read Ephesians 4:21-24. What is the goal of renewing our minds? How might a person know if they are renewing their mind?
- 4. Read 2 Corinthians 10:5. How does a person "take every thought captive?"

ASSESS

- 1. Describe a time when you were deceived by someone or something in your life. What did you learn or do about the deception? What is it about sin that typically makes it more difficult to think of as deceptive?
- 2. In your thinking, what is most beautiful about salvation?
- 3. What are a few things that are difficult for you to understand or believe about God? What steps can you take to begin to seek more understanding?
- 4. How would you describe your assurance level concerning your salvation? Why?
- 5. From the sermon, salvation brings freedom from past, present and future sin. What is the most difficult aspect of salvation for you to truly believe?

APPLY

- 1. Growth in Christ means looking more like Christ (Sanctification). What is one step of growth you can focus on this week to become more like Christ? Ask someone else to assess whether growth is actually taking place.
- 2. Pray and ask God to show you another beautiful facet of salvation.
- 3. Humbly pray together (in mutual ministry or as a group) for God to reveal any areas of your life that might need "renewed" thinking.
