


Eternal Security

Teaching Chart

SECURITY FOR THE IMPERFECT CHRISTIAN

GET YOU THINKING – Can a person who lives a consistent, unrepentant lifestyle be secure in Christ? "You say you have faith, for you believe that there is one God. Good for you! Even the demons believe this, and they tremble in terror. How foolish! Can't you see that faith without good deeds is useless?" (James 2:19-20, NLT)



"My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish, and no one will snatch them out of my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all, and no one is able to snatch them out of the Father's hand. I and the Father are one." (John 10:27-29, ESV)

Three Critical Beliefs of Security

Nothing Can Separate Us From the Love of God (Romans 8:38-39)

Salvation is a Past Act of God in Christ, Not a Current Act of Man (Ephesians 2:8-9)

Security is Rooted in Facts, Not Feelings (1 John 3:20)

Lesson

Overview: You have probably wondered, "Now that I have trusted Christ for salvation, can I do anything

to lose my salvation?" The answer is no. We believe in a doctrine (teaching) called eternal security which simply means that once you have trusted Christ for salvation, God has

promised eternal life in heaven regardless of circumstances in your life.

Purpose: To assure the believer that once he has trusted Jesus Christ as Savior, his place in heaven

is secured.

Verses: John 10:27 (ESV) My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me. 28 I give

them eternal life, and they will never perish, and no one will snatch them out of my hand. 29 My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all, and no one is able to snatch them

out of the Father's hand.

I. How do I know for sure that I am saved?

A. Jesus Christ said that those who trust Him will be eternally secure.

God cannot take away your salvation.

(John 6:37)

2. Man cannot take away your salvation.

(John 10:27-29)

- a. Oftentimes in the Bible, sheep represent Christians (v.27).
- b. Jesus Christ is the "Giver of eternal life" (v.28).
- c. Man cannot "steal" God's sheep from Him because God is the "Keeper of eternal life" (v.29).
- B. Salvation is not about what you do (works), but about what Jesus Christ already did (grace). (Ephesians 2:8-9)
 - 1. Salvation is a gift.
 - a. A gift cannot be earned.
 - 1) The gift is free to the receiver.
 - 2) The giver has already paid the price for the gift.
 - b. A gift must be received.
 - 1) The reception of the gift is the choice of the receiver.
 - 2) The receiver must be willing to accept the gift.
 - 2. If you could do anything to earn salvation, Jesus Christ's death on the cross would have been a waste.

(Galatians 2:21)

- II. Can anything (sin) or anyone (others, the devil, etc.) cause me to lose my salvation?
 - A. No! There is nothing in or out of this world that can cause you to lose your salvation. (Romans 8:38-39)
 - 1. You cannot lose salvation when you die.
 - 2. You cannot lose salvation during your lifetime.
 - 3. Angels (or demons) cannot take salvation away from you.
 - 4. Government cannot take salvation away from you.
 - 5. The devil cannot take salvation from you.
 - 6. Present circumstances cannot take your salvation away from you.
 - 7. Future circumstances cannot take away salvation away from you.
 - 8. Nothing above you can take away your salvation.
 - 9. Nothing below you can take away your salvation.
 - 10. In case anything was left out, nothing can cause you to lose your salvation.
 - B. Your salvation is secure because of your new relationship with God (child of God).
 - 1. When you trusted Christ as Savior, you were born into God's family (father/child relationship).

(John 1:12-13)

- a. You will always be your earthly father's child even if you change your name.

 Nothing could ever change that fact.
- b. Once you are a child of God, nothing you do can ever change that fact.
- 2. When you trusted Christ as Savior, you were sealed with the Holy Spirit. (Ephesians 1:13)
- III. What if I do not "feel" saved?
 - A. Feelings change.
 - 1. Salvation is not based on our feelings. (1 John 3:20)

- 2. Salvation is based on fact. (Romans 10:9) (Romans 10:13)
- B. Facts do not change.
 - 1. You must believe that God will do what He said He would do.
 - 2. You can seek counsel from a church leader.
