Pre-Video Discussion Questions

3. For those who feel comfortable, please tell the others at your table why you decided to take this class.
4. Please have someone at your table read 2 Timothy 3:16-17 and answer the following questions...
 - What are the 4 ways the Scriptures are beneficial/profitable? Briefly define each one.
 - What are the two results of Scriptures in our lives?
5. Have someone read this important statement from our church leadership concerning this class
"There will be a lot of information that you will learn over the next several months. Some of the information will be life-changing because you've never heard something taught quite like this before. However, there may be other moments in this class when you struggle keeping up or don't understand a concept or teaching. During those moments, please focus on what you understand and not what you don't. Understanding the Scriptures is a lifetime of study, not an instant grasping of every truth. Be patient with yourself. Ask God for help when you don't understand. Most of all, don't quit learning. These classes are meant to provide a greater knowledge of God that leads you to know and love Him more."

Post-Video Discussion Questions

1. Work with your table to develop a 1-2 sentence definition of the word *sin*.
2. In a culture that sees man as naturally good, how does the Bible describe sin? Find 2-3 verses that disprove man's "natural goodness."
3. Although our environments shape us, who is responsible for our sins? If we are responsible for our sin, what is the result of that?
4. Who sets the standard for what is right and wrong? Give a Scripture verse that supports your answer.
5. If you feel comfortable, please tell everyone one thing you learned today and maybe one action step you can take based on today's class.
