II. Bible Story Backstory

- 3 Patriarchs of the OT.....Abraham, Isaac, Jacob (who becomes Israel)
- Isaac married Rebekah and had twins....Esau and Jacob

"Isaac loved Esau...but Rebekah loved Jacob."

Genesis 25:28

- Jacob sneakily tricks Esau out of his blessing and birthright. Esau plans to kill Jacob. Rebekah sends Jacob away to marry a cousin. Jacob has a chance to start a clean slate
- Rachel and Jacob... "love at first sight"...contracts to work for his uncle for seven years to marry Rachel

"Now Laban had two daughters; the name of the older was Leah, and the name of the younger was Rachel. Leah had weak eyes, but Rachel had a lovely figure and was beautiful. Jacob was in love with Rachel and said, 'I'll work for you seven years in return for your younger daughter Rachel.'"

Sermon in a Sentence:

Marriage is important, but if we have *unrealistic expectations* of it, or *incorrectly prioritize* it, we're headed for disappointment or disaster.

Christian's Top Priority:

"[Jesus] 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.'

This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it:

'Love your neighbor as yourself...'"

Matthew 22:37-39 (NIV)

III. 3 Predictable Problems

(when we have unrealistic expectations/prioritize marriage -or any relationship - incorrectly)

- 1. We compromise God's standards.
 - Whenever we put a person, or goal, or anything other than God, in the place of Top Priority in our lives, it throws our whole life out of balance.
- We get demanding.
 - Sometimes the expectations and demands are unspoken and under the surface but they are there.

"There is a God-shaped vacuum in the heart of each man (person) which cannot be satisfied by any created thing but only by God the Creator, made known through Jesus Christ." Pascal

3. We end up disappointed.

"When the Lord saw that Leah was unloved, he enabled her to have children...she gave birth to a son. She named him Reuben, for she said, 'The Lord has noticed my misery, and now husband will love me." Genesis 29:31-32

"Surely this time my husband will feel affection for me, since I have given him three sons." Genesis 29:34
