Naomi's Plight Ruth 1							
The people of Israel were going through a severe in the land. Naomi's husband Elimelech, took his entire family (wife and two sons) away from their home in Bethlehem, Judah and went to live in the country of Moab for a better life. While they were there struck the family.

Turning point moment of decision:

Did you know?

Naomi hears that God has restored the crops in her homeland and she desires to go back home. Not only that, but she comes to the realization that in her age she is

unable to remarry and reproduce more son's for her daughter in law's so she gives them permission to return to their gods/lifestyles and start over. This in turn forces Orpah and Ruth to make a decision as well. Orpah whose name means decides to goes back, but Ruth the companion and friend to Naomi and went forward. Ruth 1:14
As you reflect on the turning points and decisions you've made over the course of your life, what has been the main drive behind your choices? Knowing what you know now, would you make the same decision again?
Naomi's Plight continued: Ruth 1:19-21
Even though she made the decision to return home that still didn't completely remove the heartache and despair she was going through. Healing takes time. Quit often we want to rush the process in ourselves and others, or grow impatient with those who are suffering, but this story reminds us that it's okay to express how you feel. Naomi felt about life and by God. When she left she was happily married with children but now she was sad, widowed, poor and disoriented.

stay with Naomi, but to embrace her people and serve her Ruth 1:16-17

Desire to work:

- *Land which needed to sold under economic hardship; Leviticus 25:23-28
- *The family name by virtue of a levirate marriage; Deuteronomy 25:5-10

Boaz gathers 10 witnesses and approaches the next of kin with the proposition to acquire the land and Ruth. Unfortunately he can't commit to the cause and tells Boaz to buy the land. In divine providence God was glorified in this redemption:

- *Boaz and Ruth had a son name Obed, father of Jesse, grandfather of David Ruth 4:13
- *Naomi's spirits were lifted Ruth 4:14-15
- *Ruth added to the lineage of Christ Matthew 1:5
