(verses 11-13) *Serpent was cursed to crawl on his belly/hostility between women/offspring and Satan. (verses 14-15) *Woman was given pain through child bearing; tension between husband and wife. (verse 16) *Man the ground was cursed, hard labor, death. (17-19) *Kicked out of the garden of Eden. (verse 23) |
