Delilah's Perspective: Judges 16:4-6 At the height of his time judging the Israelites Samson became a problem in the eyes of the Philistines. With that said, it was a turning point because he was also beginning to let down his guard and lose sight of his commitment to the Lord. How could this happen? Samson falls in _____ with Delilah. Remember she lives in the valley of Sorek, which is right on the boarder of the two territories. It's likely she too is a Philistine. One thing leads to another they're the new couple, talk of the town and the word gets out. The Philistine rulers want to end Samson's attacks so they approach Delilah with an offer she can't refuse. Five Philistine leaders from each city in the region go out of their way to meet with Delilah, ask her to find out what makes him _____ and how they can _____ him. To make the deal irresistible they tell her we'll give you 1,100 pieces of silver each for a total of 5,500! For Delilah it boiled down to Samson or Silver... As the story goes Delilah takes the silver and gets right to work on Samson. Remember our initial question? What kind of impact are you having in the lives of those around you and what is your motive? Yes, Samson put himself in this predicament, but as we consider Delilah's decision, what are some ways we can prevent putting profits over people or being in a relationship for personal gain only? **Delilah's Persistence: Judges 16:7-17** "Persistence can grind an iron beam down into a needle." -Chinese Proverbs In this portion of the story we see time after time Delilah asking Samson, "how can you be tied up securely." Each time Samson gave an answer, but when the Philistines came he would easily

break free and escape.

No doubt this was a weakness for Samson. For he folded when his wife was persistent and he folded here with Delilah.
As we consider Delilah's persistence and Samson's difficulty, can you identify some things that are constantly nagging, pulling and tempting you to give in to sin?
What can you do to strengthen your mind and stand firm under pressure?
Delilah's Pretense: Judges 16:18-21 Pretense: an attempt to make something that is not the case appear true.
In light of the text, Delilah attempted to make it look like she wasabout Samson but all she really cared about was the silver. What did she do? *She made it appear like she loved him. Verse 15 *She lulled Samson to sleep. Verse 19
*She cried out, "Samson! The Philistines have come to capture you!" (4X) Sadly Samson was unable to do what he had done in the past because his strength had left him. He was now bound with a bronze chain, forced to grind grain in prison. So it is with you and I when we give into our own desires/Satan's influences. We become in slaves to sin. Satan does not care about us; truth be told, we don't even care about ourselves like God does! Supporting scriptures: 2 Corinthians 11:14; Jeremiah 17:9; John 8:34
Even in the midst of our sin and shortcomings we still see a glimpse of God's grace in this story. (Verses 22-31)
